

Q9: Please provide a paragraph description of presentation:	In essence, the presentation is a review of the numerous responsibilities a prosecutor has in regard to the following: disclosing exculpatory evidence (Brady); correcting false testimony (Napue); and disclosing agreements with State witnesses (Giglio). I also cover how Brady violations are established and give several examples of egregious prosecutorial misconduct. Other topics include: "open file" jurisdictions; In Camera Review; defense due diligence; examples of "material and credible" evidence subject to disclosure; and how appellate courts have ruled in cases where the State argued that the evidence at issue was not in their possession.

Q10: Please provide a brief biography (about a paragraph) for the presenter(s):

Shawn C. Fuller is dedicated to a career in prosecution. Shawn is currently the Chief Deputy County Attorney for the Gila County Attorney's Office in Payson, Arizona. In addition to his management responsibilities, Shawn remains in the courtroom prosecuting all of Gila County's homicides. Prior to joining Gila County, Shawn was a prosecutor with the Homicide Bureau of the Maricopa County Attorney's Office in Phoenix, Arizona. Over an eight-year period, he prosecuted numerous homicide, gang-related, and capital cases. He was awarded the 2011 Prosecutor of the Year Award by the Arizona Chapter of the International Association of Arson Investigators for successfully prosecuting the cold case murder of Phoenix Firefighter Bret Tarver. Shawn is also a former Assistant United States Attorney; he prosecuted cases in Anchorage, Alaska, involving drugs, firearms, and gangs as part of the Organized Crime Drug Enforcement Task Force (OCDETF). In *United States v. Burfurd*, he tried and received a conviction in a case involving the then-largest methamphetamine seizure in Alaskan history. A "lumberjacking" cowboy at heart, Shawn has acclimated nicely to the mountain town of Payson, which is an hour and a half northeast of the Phoenix area. He lives there with his wife and two small children.
