H2109: BAIL BOND AGENTS; CIVIL; LICENSING

Licensed bail bond agents are not authorized to transact civil bonds unless the agent is also licensed as a property and casualty producer in Arizona.

H2302: DOMESTIC VIOLENCE VICTIMS; PROTECTED ADDRESS

By December 31, 2012, the Secretary of State must establish the Safe at Home Program to allow victims of domestic violence, sexual offenses, or stalking or harassment offenses to keep their residence address confidential. The program terminates July 1, 2021. The Legislature intends for the program to be funded by surcharges on fines or other penalties assessed against persons convicted of these offenses.

H2655: GANG; IMMIGRATION INTELLIGENCE; MISSION; FUNDING

The sources of deposits into the Gang & Immigration Intelligence Team Enforcement Mission (GIITEM) Fund is expanded to include use tax and TPT (sales tax) revenue from previously tax-exempt sales of valves and pipes 4" in diameter or larger which are used to transport oil, gas, water or coal slurry, along with compressors, regulators and other machinery and items used in operating the pipeline. The GIITEM Fund is divided into four sub-accounts: the mission account, the border action grants account, the border security equipment and technology account, and the border law enforcement and prosecutors account. The purposes for expenditure from each sub-account are stipulated. Makes various appropriations from the GIITEM Fund to the Attorney General's Office, the Dept of Public Safety, and the Dept of Transportation. Because of the net increase in state revenue, requires 2/3 majority in both chambers for passage (per Prop 108).

The charge of review teams established by local governments to examine instances of domestic violence related fatalities is expanded to include incidents of near fatal domestic violence, defined as an assault committed by a party to the domestic violence.

H2664: SENTENCING COMMISSION

A 20-member Arizona Sentencing Commission is established to evaluate the effectiveness of sentencing practices and policies and of alternative sentencing programs. An annual report must be submitted to the chairmen of the House and Senate Judiciary committees. The statutory life of the commission expires on July 1, 2021.

H2673: SPECIAL SENTENCING PEACE OFFICER IMPERSONATION

A person convicted of a felony offense who pretended to be a peace officer during commission of the offense, with the intent to induce another person to submit to their authority is not eligible for suspension of sentence, probation, pardon or release from confinement except under specified circumstances. The presumptive, minimum and maximum sentence for the offense is increased.

H2683: POTENTIALLY DANGEROUS PERSONS; DHS; REPORTING

The Dept of Health Services is required to establish a toll-free telephone number to connect callers to the appropriate regional behavioral health authority crisis team to receive reports of disruptive behavior, evaluate the information and take appropriate action. Employers and teachers are required to report disruptive behavior of an employee or student that might be a danger to self or others.

H2684: CHILD PROSTITUTION; SENTENCING

Eliminates the requirement that child prostitution offenses be done "knowingly" and the provision that a person engaging in prostitution with a minor be at least 18 years of age. Also eliminates different criminal classifications and sentencing levels for child prostitution which were previously dependent on the age of the victim, thereby making all child prostitution offenses a class 2 (second highest) felony.

H2687: PROSTITUTION; CHILDREN; TRAFFICKING

The list of reasons a child may be taken into temporary custody by a peace officer or CPS worker is expanded to include that there is reason to believe the child is a victim or will imminently become a victim of child prostitution or sex trafficking. A minor who is a victim of child prostitution cannot be charge with prostitution. Knowingly entering a house of prostitution of engaging a prostitution enterprise is a class 1 (highest) misdemeanor.

H2691: FIREARM SALES; REPORTING; INSPECTIONS

A person who sells 3 or more high caliber firearms (defined) to another person must report the sale and the purchaser's name to the Dept of Public Safety. Some exceptions. The department must maintain a computerized record system containing the information for the purpose of investigating and enforcing the law. Also requires the department to inspect and review the business records of any retailer who sells firearms to the public if the department becomes aware that the retailer cannot account for each firearm sold.

Various changes related to bail bond agents and bail recovery agents, including establishing new requirements for licensure, prohibited acts including prohibited collateral, requiring the Dept of Insurance to establish a schedule of reasonable bail bond agency expenses that may be charged to an arrestee, and establishing procedures if a defendant fails to appear and surrender himself to a bail bond agent. More.
