

AFFIDAVIT OF NATHAN CAMPBELL

Nathan Campbell, being duly sworn, upon oath deposes and says as follows:

1. I am a resident of Yavapai County.
2. I agree and acknowledge that “designer or synthetic drugs” contain dangerous ingredients (i.e. cannabinoids, cathinones and psilocybin) that are injurious to the residents of Yavapai County.
3. I am aware that these “designer or synthetic drugs” are marketed as, but not limited to the following: “Spice” and “Bath Salts.”
4. I am aware that these “designer or synthetic drugs” are being purchased for human consumption.
5. I am aware, by first-hand knowledge, of certain matters set forth below, that these “designer or synthetic drugs” are injurious, indecent, or offensive to the senses of the residents of Yavapai County and therefore a public nuisance.
6. I live about 500 yards away from the X-Hale Smoke Shop in Prescott Valley. I have lived at this residence since October, 2011. Since I moved into the residence I have found several aluminum foil packages scattered throughout my property including the front yard, back yard and the side of the house.
7. I have seen what appeared to be young kids leaving the X-Hale Smoke Shop, going behind the neighboring church and then smoking products purchased from the X-Hale Smoke Shop in the parking lot between the church and the Learning Castle Child Care. I have seen the same type of aluminum packaging that I found at my residence also behind the church and in the parking lot. I have also seen them smoking in the alley next to my house and I have seen the aluminum packages there also.
8. Besides the annoyance of having these packages littered throughout my residence and the neighborhood, these individuals have also agitated my dog. There are times when I have smelled an odd odor when they were smoking near my house. It smelled like some form of potpourri; I asked a friend about it and he said it was “Spice” that I was smelling.
9. Recently I asked an individual where he was getting these items and he said he was purchasing them at X-Hale Smoke Shop and Mario’s Mini Mart.

Every night people are constantly walking late at night by the house. These individuals appear to be very unstable and I never know how they might react.

10. I feel that these individuals using these products and especially the stores that are selling these products are creating a nuisance in the community where I live. I also feel that the safety of my family is put in jeopardy because of these products.




1. I am a citizen of Camp Verde in Yavapai County, Arizona. I have worked for MATFORCE, the Yavapai County Substance Abuse Coalition as the Program Manager since January 2007 and as the Executive Director of the Agency since July 2010.
2. I agree and acknowledge that “designer or synthetic drugs” contain dangerous ingredients, (i.e. cannabinoids, cathinones and psilocybin) that are injurious to the residents of Yavapai County.
3. I am aware that these “designer or synthetic drugs” are marketed as, but not limited to the following: “Go Fast”, “Spice”, “Glass Cleaner”, “Sprinklezz”, “Felt Cleaner”, “Incense”, “Go Fast Carpet Cleaner”, “Potpourri” “Exuberance Powder”, “Herbal Sachets”, “Tickle Talc” and “Bath Salts”.
4. I am aware that these “designer or synthetic drugs” are being purchased for human consumption.
5. I am aware, by first-hand knowledge; of certain matters set forth below that these “designer or synthetic drugs” are injurious, indecent, or offensive to the senses of the residents of Yavapai County and therefore a public nuisance.
6. Since January 2007, I have been working with MATFORCE. The vision statement of MATFORCE is for community members to work together to reduce substance abuse in Yavapai County. It is my job responsibility to track current trends and statistical data regarding substance abuse in Yavapai County. Since 2010, the consumption and abuse of “designer or synthetic drugs” has escalated and been a significant problem for the citizens of Yavapai County.
7. In the past two years I have spoken to multiple parents and grandparents whose children/grandchildren have been consuming “designer or synthetic drugs” causing multiple adverse effects. A few examples include:
 - A. In 2010, I had multiple phone and in person conversations with a grandmother whose two teenage grandsons had been smoking Spice. One of her grandsons developed an infection in his esophagus and lost over 40

pounds from the use of Spice. Her other grandson had multiple incidents of psychosis from the drug.

- B. In 2011, I have had multiple phone conversations with a mother of a 17 year old girl who lived in Cottonwood who became addicted to Bath Salts; the mother informed me that the drug had adverse mental and physical effects on her daughter. She informed me that her daughter lost 35 pounds and was bleeding from her nose and ears. The daughter ended up at a treatment center for the addiction.
 - C. In 2012, I have had multiple phone and in person conversations with a mother whose 26 year old son who lives in Prescott had relapsed from his addiction to meth and began using bath salts. The bath salts have caused severe psychosis. The young man attempted to kill himself and has become extremely paranoid. The family is dealing with significant stress due to the relapse. The son was purchasing the product from local businesses in Prescott.
8. In the past two years, I have spoken with multiple individuals who admit to utilizing “synthetic or designer” drugs. Multiple people in recovery have stated to me that the availability and legality of “synthetic or designer” drugs have been a factor in their relapse.
9. In my role as the Executive Director I have spoken with the employees of multiple agencies, businesses, schools and government entities where I have been informed of the adverse effects of the sale and use of “synthetic or designer” drugs. The drugs have caused adverse effects for merchants in Old Town Cottonwood, Yavapai County Juvenile Probation, Yavapai County Adult Probation, Yavapai Regional Medical Center, Verde Valley Medical Center, multiple Fire Departments in the County, and multiple Police Departments in the County. Multiple staff members of area schools have contacted MATFORCE, asking for assistance, due to the use and abuse of these products by students.

Dr. Leon Cattolico, being duly sworn, upon oath deposes and says as follows:


1. I am a resident of Yavapai County, am a retired Family Physician and I currently serve on the Steering Committee and the Board of Directors for MATFORCE.
2. I agree and acknowledge that “designer or synthetic drugs” contain dangerous ingredients (i.e. cannabinoids, cathinones and psilocybin) that are injurious to the residents of Yavapai County.
3. I am aware that these “designer or synthetic drugs” are marketed as, but not limited to the following: “Spice” and “Bath Salts.”
4. I am aware that these “designer or synthetic drugs” are being purchased for human consumption.
5. I am aware, by first-hand knowledge, of certain matters set forth below, that these “designer or synthetic drugs” are injurious, indecent, or offensive to the senses of the residents of Yavapai County and therefore a public nuisance.
6. I am aware of a young female who I understood had consumed “Spice” on multiple occasions in the past. This individual passed away and I believe if she was in fact using “Spice” that it could have been a contributing factor to her death.
7. I treated a patient who indicated that she used “Bath Salts,” though it was not clear if it was intentional. She had to be taken to the Emergency Room because of her reaction to the “Bath Salts.” She was experiencing extreme elevated blood pressure, increased heart rate, paranoia and anxiety. She came to me for a follow-up visit in which she was still experiencing elevated blood pressure, paranoia and anxiety. I had to treat her with anti-anxiety medication. I also treated her for her elevated blood pressure. On subsequent visits she was still demonstrating similar symptoms. From talking with her, the negative experiences that she had from “Bath Salts” created a disruption in her family life.

8. As a member of MATFORCE, I have been told by several residents of the City of Cottonwood of the negative effects that these products have had on the community and I also had patients complain about the pedestrian traffic created by stores selling these products.

Ivan Anderson, being duly sworn, upon oath deposes and says as follows:


1. I am a resident of Yavapai County and currently work at Verde Valley Fire District as a Certified Emergency Paramedic.
2. I agree and acknowledge that “designer or synthetic drugs” containing dangerous ingredients (i.e. cannabinoids, cathinones and psilocybin) are injurious to the residents of Yavapai County.
3. I am aware, by first-hand knowledge, of certain matters set forth below, that these “designer or synthetic drugs” are injurious, indecent, or offensive to the senses of all the residents of Yavapai County and therefore a public nuisance.
4. I have two separate stories that concern Spice and its alternate version called potpourri. The first patient was a guy in his early twenties, he had smoked Spice, been arrested and was having a bad trip. When we arrived to transport him he was sweating and he could not sit still. He was very paranoid and agitated, his heart and blood pressure were very high and he complained of his hands being numb. Just before we arrived at Verde Valley Medical Center, he told me his hands went from being numb to hurting and the pain was getting worse. I asked him if he had ever smoked Spice in the past and he said yes. I asked if he ever experienced these effects before and he said no.
5. My second patient was a twelve year old girl also here in Cottonwood. She smoked Spice, started having a bad trip and her friend called 911. She had some similar affects, her heart rate was 150, her BP was high and she complained of numbness in her feet all the way up to her waist. The girl also had a twitch in her neck, about every ten seconds her head would twitch to the left and she could not control it. It really bothered her that her head would just move on its own, it continued to do that while she was being treated in the ER, up until I left, so for at least two hours. I asked her if she had ever smoked Spice in the past and she said no, this was the first time.


Dr. Christopher Lampe, being duly sworn, upon oath deposes and says as follows:


1. I am a resident of Yavapai County and currently work at Yavapai Regional Medical Center (Y.R.M.C.) in Prescott and Prescott Valley as a Emergency Room Physician and as the base hospital Director for all Emergency Medical Services (E.M.S.) agencies that use Y.R.M.C. as their base hospital.
2. I agree and acknowledge that “designer or synthetic drugs” contain dangerous ingredients (i.e. cannabinoids, cathinones and psilocybin) that are injurious to the residents of Yavapai County.
3. I am aware that these “designer or synthetic drugs” are being purchased for human consumption and are commonly known as “Spice” and “Bath Salts.”
4. I am aware, by first-hand knowledge, of certain matters set forth below, that these “designer or synthetic drugs” are injurious, indecent, or offensive to the senses of the residents of Yavapai County and therefore a public nuisance.
5. Within the last two years I have treated or seen approximately 25 – 50 patients that have been admitted to the E.R. that were under the influence of either “Bath Salts” or “Spice.” What I have observed from my interactions with individuals using these products is an overwhelming paranoia, psychotic behavior, violent and aggressive behavior.
6. From my training and experience as a physician, it appears that the desired euphoric effects from these drugs are short lived where the psychotic effects from these drugs tend to be varied and long acting. Based on the literature and my experience, there appears to be a spike in people becoming overwhelmingly depressed or suicidal when using these drugs.
7. It is very difficult to treat these patients because of their violent and aggressive behavior towards the E.R. staff, Emergency Medical Services (E.M.S.) providers, law enforcement and members of the community. On multiple occasions, these patients require multiple staff members to try to calm them and sometimes have to physically restrain them. This disrupts the orderly flow of the Emergency Department and diverts vital resources away from sick members of our community.

8. Treating patients under the influence of these chemicals can be extremely difficult because the patients can be very uncooperative and be suffering from significant disease processes which are masked by the effects of these drugs. In addition, unlike an narcotic overdose, these drugs do not have a known antidote.
9. Often time these patients because of hallucinations sustain a variety of traumatic injuries such as injuries from dangerous motor vehicle accidents or altercations in our local establishments.
10. As the E.M.S. Medical Director I routinely am made aware of cases involving the use of these drugs and the violent effects it has on their patients and consequently the dangerous situation our local E.M.S. providers are faced with in treating these patients. These drugs create a very dangerous environment for the E.M.S. providers, E.R. Staff and law enforcement.

Robert Scott, being duly sworn, upon oath deposes and says as follows:


1. I am a resident of Yavapai County and currently work at Life Line Ambulance as a Paramedic.
2. I have worked as an Emergency Medical Technician (EMT) since January, 2009. In March, 2012 I became an EMT Paramedic. As an EMT I respond to medical emergencies and 911 calls.
3. I agree and acknowledge that “designer or synthetic drugs” contain dangerous ingredients (i.e. cannabinoids, cathinones and psilocybin) that are injurious to the residents of Yavapai County.
4. I am aware that these “designer or synthetic drugs” are marketed as, but not limited to the following: “Go Fast,” “Spice,” “Sprinklezz,” “Incense,” “Potpourri,” “Herbal Sachets,” “Glass Cleaner,” “Felt Cleaner,” “Go Fast Carpet Cleaner,” “Exuberance Powder,” “Tickle Talc” and “Bath Salts.”
5. I am aware that these “designer or synthetic drugs” are being purchased for human consumption.
6. I am aware, by first-hand knowledge, of certain matters set forth below, that these “designer or synthetic drugs” are injurious, indecent, or offensive to the senses of the residents of Yavapai County and therefore a public nuisance.
7. As an Emergency Medical Technician (Basic), I responded to a situation about a year and one half ago involving a female in her early twenties in which it was reported that she had consumed “Bath Salts”. While treating her she appeared to be severely disoriented, she did not know who we were or why we were there. She was not combative but she was uncooperative. She could not understand simple commands, her speech was incoherent and she appeared to be suffering from a severe altered mental state. There were indications that she wanted to harm herself. This took place in Prescott.
8. As an Emergency Medical Technician (Basic), I responded to a situation about one year ago involving a male in his mid-twenties that had been involved in a single car roll-over accident. Although he was alert, he was extremely combative towards all personnel on scene which included Life Line Ambulance, Prescott Fire Department and the Prescott Police Department. While making contact with him, he admitted to using “Spice.” This man’s

actions were disruptive to the normal course of treatment that would be provided because it is difficult to treat someone in this altered state. This also delayed the time it took for him to receive definitive care. This also poses potential delays in responding to other calls when dealing with this type of situation and puts a strain on the entire network of emergency responders.



Michael A. Connally, being duly sworn, upon oath deposes and says as follows:

1. I am a resident of Yavapai County and currently work at Life Line Ambulance as a Paramedic.
2. I have been an Emergency Medical Technician (EMT) since 1981. I became a Paramedic in 1995 and I have been working at Life Line Ambulance for 16 years.
3. I agree and acknowledge that “designer or synthetic drugs” contain dangerous ingredients (i.e. cannabinoids, cathinones and psilocybin) that are injurious to the residents of Yavapai County.
4. I am aware that these “designer or synthetic drugs” are marketed as, but not limited to the following: “Spice” and “Bath Salts.”
5. I am aware that these “designer or synthetic drugs” are being purchased for human consumption.
6. I am aware, by first-hand knowledge, of certain matters set forth below, that these “designer or synthetic drugs” are injurious, indecent, or offensive to the senses of the residents of Yavapai County and therefore a public nuisance.
7. About 2 or 3 years ago in Prescott I responded to a residence in which it had been reported the individuals had been smoking “Spice.” While at the residence, I came in contact with a young male who appeared to be about 19 years old who had been one of the individuals smoking the “Spice.” The young male was having a severe psychotic episode, very combative and he resisted any efforts for treatment. His speech was incoherent and he appeared to be hallucinating. He had to be physically restrained and eventually tied to a stretcher for transport. While being transported additional responders had to be in the back of the ambulance to ensure our safety and also his safety. During transport, the young male was given valium in an attempt to calm him down which had no effect. He projectile vomited all over the back of the ambulance. When we arrived at the hospital it took seven (7) individuals to safely move him from our stretcher to a hospital bed.
8. Approximately 3 weeks ago, I responded to a residence in Prescott, located about a block away from the skate park, it was reported that an individual was


acting bizarrely. We contacted the individual who had been acting bizarrely and I noticed he appeared to be twitching involuntarily. The individual initially denied any recreational drug use. When he was being transported he admitted to using methamphetamine the day prior and "Bath Salts" that same day. When we would try to interact with the individual, he had a difficult time keeping his train of thought and staying focused on the conversation. At times he would scream out incoherent statements to imaginary individuals.

9. Dealing with these types of situations hinders our ability to give proper care because often we do not know what substances they have consumed. Also, when individuals become agitated or incoherent, it requires additional resources and responders in order to ensure the patient's safety. These psychotic episodes induced by "Spice" and/or "Bath Salts" create safety concerns for ambulance personnel, law enforcement, fire fighters, hospital staff and the community at large.




Royce A. Taghon, being duly sworn, upon oath deposes and says as follows:

1. I am a resident of Yavapai County and currently work at Life Line Ambulance as an Emergency Medical Technician (EMT). I have been an EMT for 10 years and have been working at Life Line Ambulance for 9 years.
2. I agree and acknowledge that “designer or synthetic drugs” contain dangerous ingredients (i.e. cannabinoids, cathinones and psilocybin) that are injurious to the residents of Yavapai County.
3. I am aware that these “designer or synthetic drugs” are marketed as, but not limited to the following: “Spice” and “Bath Salts.”
4. I am aware that these “designer or synthetic drugs” are being purchased for human consumption.
5. I am aware, by first-hand knowledge, of certain matters set forth below, that these “designer or synthetic drugs” are injurious, indecent, or offensive to the senses of the residents of Yavapai County and therefore a public nuisance.
6. In 2010 I responded to a report of a male in his early twenties that had fallen on the side walk in front of a local eating establishment in Prescott. When I arrived at the scene the young man was bleeding, yelling, shouting profanities and flinging blood. His actions made it difficult for us as responders to provide any type of care or treatment. We eventually had to restrain him and place him on a back board in order to transport him to the hospital. While being transported he would constantly go in and out of his psychotic behavior. His behavior showed that he was suffering from hallucinations and at time he would be completely incoherent. During one of his lucid moments he did admit that he had smoked “Spice.” Once at the hospital, he had to be restrained to the hospital bed.
7. I have recently responded to at least one other incident in which the patient admitted to using “Bath Salts.” This individual had no control over his bodily movements, would constantly twitch and appeared to be hallucinating.
8. Dealing with individuals under the influence of recreational drugs such as “Bath Salts” and “Spice” makes it difficult for first responders because often times these individuals are experiencing psychotic episodes. These psychotic episodes are difficult to deal with because these individuals are unable to

respond to basic commands and appear to not even know where they are at. These individuals perceive first responders as a threat instead of someone there to help them. As a first responder, this not only puts the patient's safety in jeopardy, but also puts my own safety and the other responder's safety in jeopardy.



1. I am a resident of Yavapai County and currently work at Yavapai Regional Medical Center an Emergency Department Tech.
2. I agree and acknowledge that “designer or synthetic drugs” contain dangerous ingredients (i.e. cannabinoids, cathinones and psilocybin) that are injurious to the residents of Yavapai County.
3. I am aware that these “designer or synthetic drugs” are marketed as, but not limited to the following: “Go Fast,” “Spice,” “Sprinklezz,” “Incense,” “Potpourri,” “Herbal Sachets,” “Glass Cleaner,” “Felt Cleaner,” “Go Fast Carpet Cleaner,” “Exuberance Powder,” “Tickle Talc” and “Bath Salts.”
4. I am aware that these “designer or synthetic drugs” are being purchased for human consumption.
5. I am aware, by first-hand knowledge, of certain matters set forth below, that these “designer or synthetic drugs” are injurious, indecent, or offensive to the senses of the residents of Yavapai County and therefore a public nuisance.
6. On numerous occasions, patients have arrived to the Emergency Department under the influence of at least one or several synthetic drugs. Some of the time, these patients arrive in a state of psychosis that is not easily reversed or controlled. Body temperatures rise dangerously, and the patient expresses fear and experiences hallucinations. On more than one occasion, a patient has have to be intubated and admitted to the ICU for further care due to the effects of “bath salts”. In following the cases, the patients remained in a state of psychosis for over a week until discharged under the care of an outpatient psychiatric facility. These drugs are dangerous to the community as they instill a sense of safety to the user. They are absolutely not safe. Not even once.



In addition, patients have described an immediate addiction to obtaining more bath salts even though the side effects are undesirable.
7. In two specific instances patients on bath salts have ended up in four point leather restraints shortly after arrival in the emergency room. It appears that no amount of opiates or narcotics have helped subdue the affects of these drugs.







1. I am a resident of Yavapai County and currently work at Yavapai Regional Medical Center in the Emergency Room as a Medical Doctor. I am also the Medical Director of the Emergency Room at Yavapai Regional Medical Center West Campus and have been in that position for five (5) years.
2. I agree and acknowledge that “designer or synthetic drugs” contain dangerous ingredients (i.e. cannabinoids, cathinones and psilocybin) that are injurious to the residents of Yavapai County.
3. I am aware that these “designer or synthetic drugs” are marketed as, but not limited to the following: “Spice” and “Bath Salts.”
4. I am aware that these “designer or synthetic drugs” are being purchased for human consumption.
5. I am aware, by first-hand knowledge, of certain matters set forth below, that these “designer or synthetic drugs” are injurious, indecent, or offensive to the senses of the residents of Yavapai County and therefore a public nuisance.
6. On average we are seeing approximately ten (10) patients a week at both campuses that are being admitted to the Emergency Room for effects associated with the ingestion or use of “bath salts” and/or “spice.” Some of the symptoms that we are noticing with individuals using both of these products, but are more prevalent with individuals that have used “bath salts”, are agitation, psychosis, hallucinations, tachycardia, hypertension and tachypnea (elevated respiratory rate.)
7. The effects of these drugs seem to be long lasting. I have seen instances where individuals are still having complete psychosis even when they have not been using the synthetic drugs for three (3) days. We do not see these long lasting psychotic effects in other central nervous system stimulants such as methamphetamine or cocaine .
8. These synthetic drugs additionally appear to cause abnormal behaviors in the individuals using them. I have seen patients that have been under the influence of these synthetic drugs that have started taking their clothes off while in the Emergency Room, trying to scratch their skin off because they are

seeing bugs on their skin, and they are seeing people that are not actually there.

9. It is difficult to assess and treat these patients because of these conditions. These patients are often violent and it causes safety risks to staff that are dealing with these individuals. At this time there is no known treatment and because of their violent outbursts at times the only way that we can deal with this situation is to sedate them, paralyze them and intubate them. This puts a strain on the resources provided by the Emergency Room Department because it takes several of the staff members to treat or subdue these patients. This causes long waiting times for others that are seeking treatment at the Emergency Room.

10. Besides my safety concern for the Emergency Room staff, I am extremely concerned about the general safety of the community because you never know when one of these individuals will have a violent outburst without law enforcement present.



1. I am a resident of Yavapai County and currently work at Verde Valley Medical Center as Chief Medical Officer and Vice President of Medical Affairs and have been in this position for approximately the last 8 months.
2. I agree and acknowledge that “designer or synthetic drugs” contain dangerous ingredients (i.e. cannabinoids, cathinones and psilocybin) that are injurious to the residents of Yavapai County.
3. I am aware that these “designer or synthetic drugs” are marketed as, but not limited to the following: “Spice” and “Bath Salts.”
4. I am aware that these “designer or synthetic drugs” are being purchased for human consumption.
5. I am aware, by first-hand knowledge, of certain matters set forth below, that these “designer or synthetic drugs” are injurious, indecent, or offensive to the senses of the residents of Yavapai County and therefore a public nuisance.
6. Since becoming the Chief Medical Officer and Vice President of Medical Affairs at the Verde Valley Medical Center, our facility has been treating on average 1 – 2 patients a week that are under the influence of these synthetic drugs. From the reports I have reviewed, the typical age group that we are treating are individuals between the ages of 20 and 35.
7. These synthetic drugs are causing severe symptoms among individuals that are using them. The symptoms include agitation, psychosis, tachycardia (heart rate that exceeds the normal range) and depression.
8. Often patients under the influence of these drugs have to be sedated or secured because of the severe symptoms associated with these drugs. This endangers the safety of hospital staff treating these patients. These patients will attempt to hit and/or kick hospital personnel. At times, there has to be one on one constant care given to these patients which disrupts the ordinary course of business for the hospital because it takes away from the time and resources of the other patients. Additionally, it is often required that security personnel be present while these patients are being treated.

9. There is no known treatment or antidote for "Bath Salts" or "Spice." This makes it very difficult to treat these patients because we have to focus on the symptoms and not the underlying cause - the sometimes unknown synthetic drug. Not every patient metabolizes the "Bath Salts" or "Spice" in the same manner. The range of symptoms varies from patient to patient, thus making it even more difficult to treat. The long term effects of these drugs are unknown.

10. I believe that these synthetic drugs are dangerous to our community and should be illegal.


1. I am a resident of Yavapai County and currently work at Life Line Ambulance as Paramedic and have been in that position for two (2) years.
2. I agree and acknowledge that “designer or synthetic drugs” contain dangerous ingredients (i.e. cannabinoids, cathinones and psilocybin) that are injurious to the residents of Yavapai County.
3. I am aware that these “designer or synthetic drugs” are marketed as, but not limited to the following: “Spice” and “Bath Salts.”
4. I am aware that these “designer or synthetic drugs” are being purchased for human consumption.
5. I am aware, by first-hand knowledge, of certain matters set forth below, that these “designer or synthetic drugs” are injurious, indecent, or offensive to the senses of the residents of Yavapai County and therefore a public nuisance.
6. On average I respond to one or two calls a week in which “spice” or “bath salts” have been used. Some symptoms that I have observed with individuals ingesting “bath salts” include increased heart rate, hallucinations, individuals having a blank stare, no sense of reality, the patient cannot follow a train of thought, high blood pressure in minors and short attention spans. With “spice” we are seeing similar effects but to a lesser degree, and in addition to these symptoms we are seeing coughing and dyspnea (shortness of breath.)
7. Unlike some other illicit substances, the symptoms that we are seeing are not always consistent for each patient. For example when treating someone for a possible opiate overdose we see consistent findings in everyone who overdoses whereas with “bath salts” and “spice” there is more variation and negative effects.
8. I responded to a call in the Prescott area about a year and a half ago in which I went to administer an intravenous line (IV) on a trauma patient who admitted to injecting “bath salts”. As I was observing the veins, I noticed the veins in both arms were blackened and had been chemically cauterized by the substance. There was no flash in the catheter chamber upon venipuncture because there was so much damage to the vein it was not functioning


properly. I have seen similar damaged veins in numerous other patients that have admitted to "bath salt" use.

9. About one year ago, I responded to call in the Dewey area in which a young teenage female had admitted using "spice". She had a blank stare and was verbally unresponsive. When I took her blood pressure it was at approximately 160 mm/Hg which would be hypertension even for an elderly adult.
10. In May, 2012, I responded to a call in the Paulden area in which a young male admitted using "spice" and his breathing was rapid, increased heart rate and sweating profusely. The patient thought the "spice" was laced with something but he did not know what.
11. On June 5, 2012, I responded to a call of a young male experiencing bouts of unconsciousness or fainting. When I arrived on the scene I saw three individuals trying to help the patient walk and it appeared that he was stumbling and unable to walk himself. When I first made contact with him, he admitted to using "spice." At this point he was very unbalanced, unable to stand on his own, hypertensive, eyes wondering, and unable to focus. I checked his pupils and they were nonreactive. At this point, he passed out on scene. I administered an IV, and gave him an opiate reversal agent and it had no effect. When he passed out, he had no reflexes, no responses – he was out. Even when we tried more aggressive measures like a hard sternum rub there was still no response. I was about to intubate him at this point when all the sudden he regained consciousness. While transporting this individual to the hospital, these episodes of unconsciousness occurred two more times. While he was unconscious, he was unable to breathe on his own. I have never seen anyone regain consciousness to that degree after unresponsiveness and having it occur three separate times was unusual.

DECLARATION OF CASSANDRA PRIOLEAU, Ph.D.

I, Cassandra Prioleau, declare and say:

1. I am an employee of the United States Department of Justice, Drug Enforcement Administration (DEA). I have been employed by DEA since October 2008.
2. One of my primary responsibilities as a Pharmacologist at DEA's Drug and Chemical Evaluation Section (ODE) is to review drugs and other substances for possible control under the Controlled Substances Act (CSA), 21 U.S.C. § 801 *et seq.* (As used in this declaration, the acronym "CSA" also refers to the Controlled Substances Import and Export Act, 21 U.S.C. § 951 *et seq.*)
3. Since joining ODE, I have reviewed a number of drugs and other substances and have prepared documents as to their control status under the CSA, including substances reviewed under 21 U.S.C. § 802(32), which relied on an evaluation and classification of their pharmacological effects.
4. The CSA was amended in 1986 by enactment of the Controlled Substance Analogue Enforcement Act. This law provides for controlled substance analogues, to the extent that they are intended for human consumption, to be treated as Schedule I controlled substances for the purposes of any Federal law, 21 U.S.C. § 813 (i.e., the full effect of the CSA and its implementing regulations including criminal, civil and administrative penalties, sanctions and regulatory controls relating to Schedule I substances will apply to the manufacture, distribution, dispensation, possession (and possession with intent to manufacture, distribute, or dispense), importation, and exportation of controlled substance analogues).

5. The analogue provision of the CSA recognizes that drug and chemical traffickers may traffic substances that fall within the same chemical structure category as substances in Schedule I and Schedule II but are chemically modified so as not to be currently controlled, while retaining pharmacological activity that mimics the controlled substance.
6. Title 21 U.S.C. § 802(32) defines a Schedule I controlled substance analogue to mean a substance:
 - a. the chemical structure of which is substantially similar to the chemical structure of a controlled substance in Schedule I or II;
 - b. which has a pharmacological effect (stimulant, depressant, or hallucinogenic effect on the central nervous system) that is substantially similar to or greater than the pharmacological effect of a controlled substance in Schedule I or II; or
 - c. which was represented or intended by the offender to have a pharmacological effect substantially similar to or greater than a Schedule I or II controlled substance
7. Schedule I and Schedule II substances that are controlled under the CSA are categorized in the Code of Federal Regulations (CFR), 21 C.F.R. § 1308.11 *et seq.*, by the pharmacological effects that they have on the central nervous system. These pharmacological effects are stimulant, depressant, or hallucinogenic effects.
8. Schedule I and Schedule II substances also can be categorized based on a common core chemical structure, which include the phenethylamine core chemical structures, as well as others.

9. Numerous substances of the phenethylamine class (e.g., amphetamine, methamphetamine, methylone, MDMA, methcathinone, and cathinone) increase monoamine concentrations in the synaptic cleft. An increase in monoamine concentrations in the central nervous system is thought to be involved in the stimulant and hallucinogenic effects of the above mentioned phenethylamine class of drugs.
10. Some examples of phenethylamines that are controlled in Schedule I or Schedule II are 4-methoxyamphetamine, 3,4-methylenedioxymethamphetamine (MDMA), methamphetamine, and amphetamine. However, the CSA does not directly control all possible substances that are categorized as phenethylamines by naming or defining them in Schedule I or Schedule II.
11. A substance that is a phenethylamine can be further subclassified as a beta-keto-phenethylamine if it contains a specific type of chemical modification to the core phenethylamine chemical structure. beta-Keto-phenethylamines are commonly referred to as synthetic cathinones.
12. Synthetic cathinones (e.g., methylone, methcathinone, mephedrone, and 3,4-methylenedioxypyrovalerone (MDPV)), like numerous substances of the phenethylamine class (e.g., amphetamine, MDMA, and methamphetamine), act as central nervous system stimulants/ hallucinogens.
13. Synthetic cathinones are sometimes sold as "bath salts," but these substances are not toiletries as the name implies. They are substances that are consumed for their effects on the central nervous system.

14. On October 21, 2011, DEA emergency scheduled the synthetic cathinones methylone, MDPV, and mephedrone to avoid imminent hazards to public safety, 76 Fed. Reg. 65371.
15. On July 9, 2012, the Synthetic Drug Abuse Prevention Act of 2012 was enacted and it permanently controlled the synthetic cathinones MDPV and mephedrone as Schedule I substances under the CSA.
16. Drug and chemical traffickers may traffic novel substances that fall within the same chemical structure category and retain pharmacological activity as the schedule I phenethylamine or synthetic cathinone, but these novel substances are chemically modified so as not to be currently controlled.
17. Many substances that are categorized as synthetic cathinones, but not directly controlled under the CSA, may be Schedule I controlled substance analogues as defined by 21 U.S.C. §§ 802(32) and 813. The following is an excerpt of synthetic cathinones that are sometimes sold as “bath salts” at retail shops or over the internet and have been reviewed by scientific experts within the DEA.

DEA experts have concluded that these substances have a chemical structure which is substantially similar to a Schedule I or II controlled substance, and pharmacological effects substantially similar to a Schedule I or II controlled substance. Many other such substances may qualify as Schedule I controlled substance analogues under the CSA.

DECLARATION OF Thomas DiBerardino, Ph.D.

I, Thomas DiBerardino, declare and say:

1. I am an employee of the United States Department of Justice, Drug Enforcement Administration (DEA). I have been employed by DEA since November 1994 as a chemist within the Office of Diversion Control.
2. One of my primary responsibilities as a chemist at DEA's Drug and Chemical Evaluation Section (ODE) is to review the chemical structure of drugs and other substances for possible control under the Controlled Substances Act (CSA), 21 U.S.C. § 801 *et seq.* (As used in this declaration, the acronym "CSA" also refers to the Controlled Substances Import and Export Act, 21 U.S.C. § 951 *et seq.*).
3. Since joining ODE, I have reviewed a number of drugs and other substances and have prepared documents as to their control status under the CSA, including substances reviewed under 21 U.S.C. § 802(32), which relied on an evaluation and classification of their chemical structure.
4. Title 21 U.S.C. § 802(32) defines a schedule I controlled substance analogue, which is a substance that is not directly regulated as a controlled substance but, if intended for human consumption, 21 U.S.C. § 813, is to be treated as a schedule I controlled substance for the purposes of Federal law.
5. The analogue provision of the CSA recognizes that unscrupulous persons may traffic substances that fall within the same chemical structure category as substances in schedule I and schedule II but are chemically modified so as not to be currently controlled, while retaining their pharmacological activity that mimic the controlled substance.
6. Schedule I and schedule II contain substances that can be categorized based on a common core chemical structure, which include the phenethylamine and aminoalkylindole core chemical structures, as well as others.

7. The CSA does not directly control all possible substances that are categorized as phenethylamines or aminoalkylindoles by naming or defining them in schedule I or schedule II.
8. Some substances within these categories have chemical group attachments that differ from those in the schedules. It is the different chemical group attachments to the core phenethylamine or aminoalkylindole chemical structure that gives rise to the various substances within the category.
9. Many substances that are categorized as phenethylamines or aminoalkylindoles, but not directly controlled under the CSA, may be schedule I controlled substance analogues as defined by 21 U.S.C. § 802(32).
10. Some examples of phenethylamines controlled in schedule I or schedule II are 4-methoxyamphetamine, 3,4-methylenedioxymethamphetamine, methamphetamine, and amphetamine. An example of a schedule I controlled substance analogue based on the phenethylamine core chemical structure is 4-fluoroamphetamine, 2-(methylamino)-1-phenyl-pentane-1-one (pentedrone) and alpha-pyrrolidinovalerophenone (alpha-pyrrolidinopentiophenone or α -PVP).
11. A substance that is a phenethylamine can be categorized as a beta-keto-phenethylamine if it contains a specific type of chemical modification to the core phenethylamine chemical structure. beta-Keto-phenethylamines are commonly referred to as synthetic cathinones.
12. Synthetic cathinones are sometimes sold as “bath salts” but are not toiletries, as the name implies, but are substances consumed for their effect on the central nervous system.
13. Because of their risk to the public health, DEA emergency scheduled the synthetic cathinones methyldone, 3,4-methylenedioxypyrovalerone (MDPV), and mephedrone, 76 Fed. Reg. 65371, and has treated similar substances as schedule I controlled substance analogues for the purposes of Federal law when they were sold indiscriminately, mostly to walk-in customers by retailers or over the internet.
14. Some examples of synthetic cathinones that are sold as “bath salts” and are determined to meet the definition of a schedule I controlled substance analogue by the

Drug Enforcement Administration include pentylone, pentedrone, butylone, 4-fluoromethcathinone, 3-fluoro-methcathinone, α -PVP, and 4-ethyl-n-ethylcathinone. Many more such substances may qualify as schedule I controlled substance analogues under the CSA.

15. As with the beta-keto-phenethylamines, substances that are categorized as aminoalkylindoles have been emergency scheduled by placing them into schedule I (76 Fed. Reg. 11075, 77 Fed. Reg. 12201), which include 1-pentyl-3-(1-naphthoyl)indole (JWH-018), 1-(2-morpholinoethyl)-3-(1-naphthoyl)indole (JWH-200), and 1-butyl-3-(1-naphthoyl)indole (JWH-073). (JWH-018, JWH-200, and JWH-073 have now been permanently placed in schedule I by virtue of the July 9, 2012 enactment of the Synthetic Drug Abuse Prevention Act of 2012.)
16. Substances that fall within the category of aminoalkylindoles are sometimes sold as "spice," several of which have been identified by the Drug Enforcement Administration to be schedule I controlled substance analogues. These substances include 1-(5-fluoropentyl)-3-(2,2,3,3-tetramethylcyclopropoyl)indole (XLR11), 1-(5-fluoropentyl)-3-(4-methyl-1-naphthoyl)indole (MAM-2201), 1-pentyl-3-(2-methylphenylacetyl)indole (JWH-251), 1-pentyl-3-(4-methoxybenzoyl)indole (RCS-4), 1-(5-fluoropentyl)-3-(2-iodobenzoyl)indole (AM694), 1-pentyl-3-(2-chlorophenylacetyl)indole (JWH-203), 1-hexyl-3-(1-naphthoyl)indole (JWH-019), 1-pentyl-3-(2-methoxyphenylacetyl)indole (JWH-250), and others. The last five substances have been permanently placed in schedule I by virtue of the July 9, 2012 enactment of the Synthetic Drug Abuse Prevention Act of 2012.

7. We had a client come to our unit from an inpatient program where she was being seen for psychotic behaviors, she denied to them any bath salts us. She was properly placed on an anti psychotic but soon after coming to the unit she was having a problem with the medications. I asked her if she had ever taken bath salts and she admitted that she had but was too ashamed to tell anyone. Her use led her into psychotic behaviors and her shame led to a misdiagnosis. This worries me because medications need to be used for what they are intended for and the fact that bath salts do not show up in a UA could lead to someone being improperly medicated and misdiagnosed if they are not honest about their use.


8. I have seen clients in the ER who were on bath salts and were unaware of the dangers that these designer drugs could cause. Many people feel that since they are legal they do not interfere with their recovery. I saw a former meth addict who had years of recovery who used these not knowing that they were in any way related to an amphetamine and was surprised at the fact that he became psychotic after use.

9. As a treatment provider I struggle with the fact that these drugs are designed to avoid any legal consequences but the designers do not seem to care about the ramifications to the users medical, behavioral, relationship, spiritual and vocational health.

In my office—while denying he was using drugs of any kind—his behavior became psychotic, kicking my desk, pacing, verbal outbursts, physical distressed.

From reviewing my bank account activity, I noticed two (2) bank card transactions were made at the X-Hale Smoke Shop in Prescott Valley which I know to be a retailer that sells “Bath Salts” and/or “Glass Cleaner.” My husband and I went to X-Hale Smoke Shop on or about April 6, 2012 and spoke with Paula Farley and obtained a picture with my cell phone of a receipt of a purchase made in the amount of \$29.99. 
1. I am a resident of Bisbee, Arizona, however my son Calvin John Forrey, prior to his death was a resident of Yavapai County.

He admitted to me that he had been using a substance called “bath salts.”
8. When I picked him up from the hospital I also observed that he had lost a lot of weight. His face was very gaunt looking; I was shocked at his appearance. When we got him home, he seemed to have his appetite back but while on “bath salts” he would only get cravings for sweets.
9. I did not know that he had continued using “bath salts” after he got out of the hospital. I initially thought that he had just relapsed the one last time before


he died but his mother told me that he would go out late at night and stay out all night many times.



1. I am a resident of Yavapai County and currently work at Prescott Valley Police Department as a police officer.
2. I agree and acknowledge that “designer or synthetic drugs” contain dangerous ingredients (i.e. cannabinoids, cathinones and psilocybin) that are injurious to the residents of Yavapai County.
3. I am aware that these “designer or synthetic drugs” are marketed as, but not limited to the following: “Go Fast,” “Spice,” “Sprinklezz,” “Incense,” “Potpourri,” “Herbal Sachets,” “Glass Cleaner,” “Felt Cleaner,” “Go Fast Carpet Cleaner,” “Exuberance Powder,” “Tickle Talc” and “Bath Salts.”
4. I am aware that these “designer or synthetic drugs” are being purchased for human consumption.
5. I am aware, by first-hand knowledge, of certain matters set forth below, that these “designer or synthetic drugs” are injurious, indecent, or offensive to the senses of the residents of Yavapai County and therefore a public nuisance.
6. I have been a police officer in Yavapai County for 16 years. In 2000 I was certified as a Drug Recognition Expert (D.R.E.) and in 2002 I was certified as Drug Recognition Expert Instructor. I have completed nearly 220 drug influence evaluations from that period to the present and have assisted other D.R.E.’s with another 100 or so drug influence evaluations.
7. A D.R.E. has a unique opportunity to talk to and ask questions of drug users and abusers to gain insights into life-styles and life-choices that most police officers are generally not privy to. Many drug users express remorse for their behavior, actions and decisions... but an equal number will truthfully tell you that they like using drugs, like the way drugs makes them feel, like that drugs brings excitement to their life, like that drugs help their confidence in social situations, or in getting through the day... and they have no intention to stop using drugs.
8. From my experience as a Narcotics Officer with the YCSO Special Crimes Unit (S.C.U.), from August 2001 through January 2005, I have seen a decrease in methamphetamine use from that time to a recent increase in the use of new synthetic drugs, such as “Spice” and “Bath Salts.”


9. In recent years I've encountered many users of synthetics such as "Bath Salts", "Window Cleaner", "Spice" and other synthetics who state that a downside to using synthetic drugs is that the effects are harsh and dangerously unpredictable.
10. I talked to one regular marijuana user (under 18 years old) who stated he'd smoked "spice" earlier in the day. He said he doesn't like using "spice" because it makes him "edgy" and "aggressive". The subject was contacted pursuant to a traffic stop after he had been observed running Stop Signs and red lights in a residential neighborhood (PVPD DR # 10-38294).
11. I've talked with numerous subjects who've experienced using both methamphetamine and "bath salts" (or "window cleaner" or "white lady" or "naked lady"). All state that the synthetics are worse or less desirable than methamphetamine or other common stimulant-based drugs because the effects are so volatile. All were seasoned drug users who expressed some degree of fear regarding the harmfulness of synthetics.
12. Last year I assisted in investigating a smoke shop robbery in which a suspect stole a quantity of "glass cleaner" and then nearly ran over the owner of the store with his vehicle while fleeing the scene. The suspect was subsequently located at his home in Prescott where he appeared to be experiencing a form of psychosis, apparently as a result of ingesting the synthetic drugs he had stolen. The suspect admitted to committing the robbery and stated he is a drug addict (PVPD DR # 11-29317).
13. Last month I completed a D.R.E on a subject who ran a red light and crashed into another vehicle traveling legally through a busy intersection on SR 69. The subject admitted to ingesting methadone just prior to the crash but displayed classic antagonistic effects of poly-drug (stimulant-narcotic) use during the drug recognition evaluation. The suspect displayed extreme disorientation, violent mood swings and hallucinations during the course of the evaluation. The suspect admitted to the use of multiple narcotic drugs as well as ant-depressants in addition to recent usage of "spice". The suspect vehemently denied use of "bath salts" or other synthetic stimulants. A preliminary urine test showed the presence of stimulants. A blood sample was sent to the Az. DPS crime lab with a request for complete drug analysis. Results are pending (PVPD DR # 12-16429).
14. Several weeks ago I completed a D.R.E. on a subject who admitted to use of "Naked Lady" (a stimulant based synthetic cathinone purchased at a local "smoke shop") within the past 48 hours. The suspect was reported to law enforcement as an aggressive/erratic driver on Glassford Hill Road. On location and contact the suspect vehicle rolled backward and struck the front of a patrol vehicle. The suspect displayed symptoms commonly seen in


methamphetamine users, to include sleep deprivation, dehydration, elevated pulse and blood pressure, dilated pupils and no reaction to light. These symptoms are extremely dangerous especially for an individual who is operating a motor vehicle. (PVPD DR # 12-17212.)

1. I am a resident of Yavapai County and currently work at the Yavapai County Sheriff's Office as a Deputy Sheriff. I have been employed as a law enforcement since 2007.
2. I am a certified Drug Recognition Expert and received my certification in 2010. As a Drug Recognition Expert I have done approximately 26 evaluations and I am familiar with the signs and symptoms of impairment induced by illicit substances.
3. I agree and acknowledge that "designer or synthetic drugs" contain dangerous ingredients (i.e. cannabinoids, cathinones and psilocybin) that are injurious to the residents of Yavapai County.
4. I am aware that these "designer or synthetic drugs" are marketed as, but not limited to the following: "Go Fast," "Spice," "Sprinklezz," "Incense," "Potpourri," "Herbal Sachets," "Glass Cleaner," "Felt Cleaner," "Go Fast Carpet Cleaner," "Exuberance Powder," "Tickle Talc" and "Bath Salts."
5. I am aware that these "designer or synthetic drugs" are being purchased for human consumption.
6. I am aware, by first-hand knowledge, of certain matters set forth below, that these "designer or synthetic drugs" are injurious, indecent, or offensive to the senses of the residents of Yavapai County and therefore a public nuisance.
7. In November, 2011, I responded to a call regarding a possible vehicle theft in the Walker area of Prescott. During my investigation, I spoke with a number of individuals that had indicated that the vehicle owner had ingested a large amount of "Bath Salts" and "Spice." They indicated that after the owner of the vehicle had smoked and ingested "Bath Salts", he thought he was a Ninja Warrior and he abandoned the vehicle. The owner of the vehicle was located by Prescott Police Department and was admitted to Windhaven Psychiatric Hospital in Prescott Valley. While the owner of the vehicle was in Windhaven Psychiatric Hospital, his mother had reported the vehicle missing. I contacted the owner of the vehicle at the Psychiatric Hospital and he admitted to using "Bath Salts." Even when I spoke with him, he appeared to be hallucinating and the staff had to assist in restraining him. I then went to


the location of where they were camped and I found several empty packages of items consistent with "Bath Salts" and "Spice" type products. (YCSO 11-036415)

8. In May, 2012, I responded to a disorderly conduct call in the Castle Canyon Mesa area regarding a continuous fight. I had previous knowledge that the individuals that reside at the residence are drug users and have used "Spice" and "Bath Salts." As I approached the residence, a male subject came out of the residence in only his shorts, sweating profusely, yelling and making incoherent statements. As I approached the gate, the individual started waving his arms and yelling at me. I told him to stop and put his arms down. He continued to act erratically. I then pulled my taser and commanded him to stop at which point he began to comply with my orders. I then spoke with the individual who indicated he was not taking his psych medications. He told me that he had not slept and that he was seeing little Mexicans "beat on his eyeballs." Upon further investigation, another individual had advised me the suspect had been smoking "Bath Salts." (YCSO 12-015262)
9. Within the last 6 months, I have investigated approximately 4 or 5 individuals that have been driving under the influence of "Bath Salts." Due to the difficulties in testing these substances, I have had to rely on admissions and poor Field Sobriety Tests when conducting these investigations. In cases when individuals have admitted to "Bath Salts" use and I have done a DRE investigation, I have seen effects nearly identical to Central Nervous System stimulants commonly found in methamphetamine and amphetamines.
10. I have investigated a number of individuals that have either possessed "Spice" or were driving under the influence of "Spice." From my training and experience as a DRE, the signs and symptoms are consistent with cannabis use.

3. I agree and acknowledge that "designer or synthetic drugs" contain dangerous ingredients (i.e. cannabinoids, cathinones and psilocybin) that are injurious to the residents of Yavapai County.
4. I am aware that these "designer or synthetic drugs" are marketed as, but not limited to the following: "Go Fast," "Spice," "Sprinklezz," "Incense," "Potpourri," "Herbal Sachets," "Glass Cleaner," "Felt Cleaner," "Go Fast Carpet Cleaner," "Exuberance Powder," "Tickle Talc" and "Bath Salts."

During this time the female driver exhibited extreme mood swings consistent with someone under the influence of a stimulant.

9. Upon further investigation, the female driver said she wanted to tell me something. At this point she indicated there was some contraband in the vehicle to include a syringe. The female driver admitted that the syringe had been used to inject "Bath Salts." At that point, I did a visual inspection of her arms and noticed a fresh injection site that was black in color and which appeared to be infected. The female driver admitted that she had been injecting "Bath Salts" into her arm. She also admitted that she had recently snorted "Bath Salts."
10. The female driver admitted to using "Bath Salts" within the Prescott area. She also indicated that she purchased the "Bath Salts" from a local convenience store but would not give additional information as to which store. The female driver indicated that the "Bath Salts" produced a similar reaction to that of methamphetamine and that she was using these products because she believed they were legal.
11. Due to my training and experience, I believe that the female driver's ability to drive was impaired to at least the slightest degree based on my observations and additional testing. I believe that "Bath Salts" were a contributing factor.
12. When the female driver was arrested and transported to the jail for processing, she became very irate and uncontrollable. At this point, additional measures were taken by the jail personnel to secure the female driver and they had to place her in a separate cell for her safety.
13. Within the last year, I have also been in contact with approximately 15 separate drivers who admitted using "Spice" prior to driving. I found these drivers' signs and symptoms of impairment to be consistent with someone driving under the influence of marijuana. These drivers indicated that they used "Spice" as a legal alternative to marijuana. One individual admitted to using "Spice" five or six times a day.
14. Due to my training and experience, I believe the consumption or ingestion of "Spice" impairs a person's ability to drive a motor vehicle.


1. I am a resident of Yavapai County and currently work at Prescott Valley Police Department (P.V.P.D.) as a police officer. I have been employed at P.V.P.D. for approximately sixteen (16) years. I am currently assigned to the Partners Against Narcotics Task Force (P.A.N.T.) as a Narcotics Supervisor and have been so for the last 3 ½ years.
2. I agree and acknowledge that “designer or synthetic drugs” contain dangerous ingredients (i.e. cannabinoids, cathinones and psilocybin) that are injurious to the residents of Yavapai County.
3. I am aware that these “designer or synthetic drugs” are marketed as, but not limited to the following: “Go Fast,” “Spice,” “Sprinklezz,” “Incense,” “Potpourri,” “Herbal Sachets,” “Glass Cleaner,” “Felt Cleaner,” “Go Fast Carpet Cleaner,” “Exuberance Powder,” “Tickle Talc” and “Bath Salts.”
4. I am aware that these “designer or synthetic drugs” are being purchased for human consumption, although they are labeled as “not for human consumption.”
5. I am aware, by first-hand knowledge, of certain matters set forth below, that these “designer or synthetic drugs” are injurious, indecent, or offensive to the senses of the residents of Yavapai County and therefore a public nuisance.
6. Over the last year, I have interviewed or have been present for interviews of informants who have consumed “Bath Salts.” These informants report the “Bath Salts” having effects similar to methamphetamine, but also including negative effects like hallucinations, extreme anger and uncontrollable anxiety.
7. On December 27, 2011, during the course of a drug investigation, officers from the P.A.N.T. Task Force, Yavapai County Sheriff’s Office and P.V.P.D. were involved in a high speed chase through residential and business areas in Prescott Valley. The suspect was ultimately apprehended after his vehicle went into a ditch. In a later interview, the suspect admitted to injecting “Bath Salts” prior to the high speed chase. The suspect reported being extremely paranoid after consuming “Bath Salts,” which contributed to his decision to flee from law enforcement. Officers found evidence, including blood and syringes, that indicated the suspect was ingesting “Bath Salts” while in his


vehicle. This incident consumed a great deal of law enforcement resources and endangered the community. (Y.C.S.O. Report No. 11-041795)

8. On February 23, 2012, I responded to a Prescott Valley residence in reference to a medical call for drug use. Upon arriving, I observed a male subject lying on his bed who was visibly agitated and excited. The subject was yelling for water, appeared frightened, and appeared to be helpless. Because of the subject's actions, law enforcement officers secured the subject for his own safety and the safety of others in the residence. The subject admitted to using "Spice" and believed the "Spice" was causing his "brain to be on fire." The subject was taken to Yavapai Regional Medical Center East Campus in Prescott Valley for medical attention. (Y.C.S.O. Report No. 12-006006)
9. Based on my experience as a law enforcement officer with eight (8) years of narcotics investigation experience, I am extremely concerned about the impact "synthetic or designer drugs" will continue to have on the community if this issue is not addressed.

1. As the PANT Sergeant I oversaw an operation in which detectives made undercover buys of “Bath Salts” from various local retailers. These buy occurred during the month of February, 2012. These buys occurred at the following local retailers: X-hale Smoke Shop in Prescott Valley; Mario’s Mini Mart in Prescott Valley; Mikes Mini Mart in Prescott; The C-Stop in Prescott and the Quick Stop in Prescott. Items obtained from these buys were sent to the DPS lab in Flagstaff for testing. The test results did not show any banned substances under Arizona Law but it did show that the items contained “pentedrone”, “pentylone” and “alpha-pvp which are analogs to banned substances under both Arizona law and federal law.
2. As the PANT Sergeant I oversaw an operation in which stores that have been identified as selling synthetic cannabinoids and cathinones were presented with a Synthetic Drug Community Protection Agreement asking them to voluntarily stop selling synthetic drugs. Stores that refused to sign the Agreement were given Legal Notice that these synthetic drugs contain dangerous chemicals that are harmful to the resident of Yavapai County and they are being purchased for human consumption.

The following stores refused to sign the Agreement and were presented with the Legal Notice:

- The Island Store in Prescott
- Wes Lance Trading Co. in Camp Verde
- Quick Stop in Prescott
- Mario’s Mini Mart in Prescott Valley


The following stores would not commit to signing:

Mark J. McClain, being duly sworn, upon oath deposes and says as follows:

1. I am a resident of Yavapai County and currently work at Prescott Police Department (P.P.D.) as an Investigator, currently assigned to the Partners Against Narcotics Trafficking (P.A.N.T.) Task Force. I have been employed with P.P.D. for 23 years and have been assigned to P.A.N.T. for the last 3 years.
2. I agree and acknowledge that “designer or synthetic drugs” contain dangerous ingredients (i.e. cannabinoids, cathinones and psilocybin) that are injurious to the residents of Yavapai County. Additionally, these “designer or synthetic drugs” may contain unknown ingredients that are injurious to the residents of Yavapai County.
3. I am aware that these “designer or synthetic drugs” are marketed as, but not limited to the following names: “Go Fast,” “Spice,” “Sprinklezz,” “Incense,” “Potpourri,” “Herbal Sachets,” “Glass Cleaner,” “Felt Cleaner,” “Go Fast Carpet Cleaner,” “Exuberance Powder,” “Amped Lady Bug Attractant,” “White Lightening,” “Molly’s,” “Eight Ballz,” “9 Ball Felt Cleaner,” “Tickle Talc,” “Crazy Train,” “Diamond Dust,” “White Girl,” and “Bath Salts.”
4. I am aware that these “designer or synthetic drugs” are being purchased for human consumption, although the packaging states “not for human consumption.”
5. I am aware, by first-hand knowledge, of certain matters set forth below, that these “designer or synthetic drugs” are injurious, indecent, or offensive to the senses of the residents of Yavapai County and therefore a public nuisance.
6. On occasion I have observed “Spice” being displayed directly beside glass smoking pipes within retail outlets in Yavapai County. I have purchased “Spice” within Yavapai County retail stores in various flavors, including strawberry, blueberry, vanilla, mint, bubblegum, pina colada and kush (marijuana). Quik Stop, located at 447 S. Montezuma in Prescott, AZ, offered the largest selection of “Spice” flavors for purchase. This retail store is located within ¼ mile of a local junior high school where students range in age from 12 – 14 years old.
7. I have learned that a local retail store has displayed both “Bath Salts” and glass oil burner pipes adjacent to one another. When “Bath Salts” are sold at

this store, an offer to purchase a pipe is made by a retail clerk. This suggests to the purchaser that "Bath Salts" can be consumed through the pipe.


8. During a recent purchase of "Bath Salts" from X-Hale Smoke Shop in Prescott Valley, AZ, a material informant was required to sign a waiver form stating that he/she knows that "Bath Salts" are not for human consumption. I have spoken with at least fifteen (15) "Bath Salts" users that know of no other legitimate use of "Bath Salts" other than to smoke or inject them into their bodies as a recreational drug.
9. In February, 2012, I was requested to assist the Prescott Valley Police Department and Central Yavapai Fire Department in reference to a drug investigation. I contacted an approximately 27 year old male who was complaining that his head and brain were "on fire." He was demanding water to alleviate this feeling and was eventually transported to the emergency room at Yavapai Regional Medical Center East Campus. During my investigation, the subject stated that he had recently smoked "Spice" and believed that the "Spice" brought on his need for assistance.
10. During 2010, I arrested a person for the use and sale of methamphetamine. For the next 7 or 8 months this person assisted law enforcement as a confidential informant that resulted in the arrest and conviction of approximately 12 fellow methamphetamine users/dealers. During this time the confidential informant's contributions to law enforcement were reliable, detailed and specific, although it was reported that she was using methamphetamine. In 2011, this confidential informant began using "Bath Salts" and lost contact with me. Through other subjects, I learned that the confidential informant was consuming large amounts of "Bath Salts." In the Spring of 2012, this former confidential informant ran into the Miller Valley Elementary School in Prescott, AZ, screaming that "people with guns" were after her. The Elementary School staff and students ranging in age from 4 – 11 were placed in lockdown status for their safety. P.P.D. patrol officers contacted the former confidential informant, who reported that "people with guns" were P.A.N.T. investigators and that she had a warrant for her arrest. It is believed that the reported consumption of "Bath Salts" is what caused this vivid hallucination and paranoid behavior.
11. I have had conversations with a subject that has an extensive recreational drug use history (including, but not limited to, marijuana, methamphetamine, cocaine, heroin, acid/LSD and peyote). Based on his actions as a result of consuming these drugs, this subject has been incarcerated numerous times, including two prison sentences in the Arizona Department of Corrections. This subject told me that he enjoyed the high or physical reaction of these drugs. This subject also told me that he consumed "Bath Salts" once and the high or physical reaction that he received was the "worst of all." This subject stated that he had no control over his body or his mind after he consumed

“Bath Salts.” Based on his negative experience with “Bath Salts,” he has assured me he will never try or consume “Bath Salts” again.

In March, 2012, I was presented with test results by a defense attorney indicated that an item, "Eight Ballz Glass Cleaner" believed to be a "Bath Salt", purchased from the X-Hale Smoke Shop in Prescott Valley did not contain certain banned items per Arizona Law. I contacted American International Biotechnology, LLC which conducted the test and asked if they could send me a report showing what was "Eight Ballz Glass Cleaner" actually contained. I received a report from the lab showing that it contained "pentedrone", "alpha-pvp" and "pentyllone" which I am aware are not banned under Arizona Law but considered to be "Bath Salts".
2. On June 27, 2012, I had an undercover informant conduct controlled buys from the following stores, X-Hale Smoke Shop, The Texaco in Prescott Valley, Smoke N' Thingz in Prescott Valley and the Quick Stop in Prescott. The informant was able to purchase items I believe consistent with "Spice" and "Bath Salts" from the X-Hale Smoke Shop. From the remaining shops the informant was able to purchase items which are consistent with synthetic cannabinoids or what is commonly referred to as "Spice."

The sample you provided has been analyzed according to our Standard Operating Protocol ANALCHEM00066 "Detection of Stimulants by GC/MS." A stimulant such as methylenedioxypropylamphetamine (MDPV) has no FDA approved medical uses and is a known psychoactive drug which is reported to have amphetamine-like or cocaine-type effects. In October, 2011, the United States Drug Enforcement Administration (DEA) exercised its emergency scheduling authority to control three synthetic stimulants (Mephedrone, 3,4 methylenedioxypropylamphetamine (MDPV) and Methylone) used to make products marketed as "bath salts" and "plant food". In the estimation of the DEA, this action was necessary to prevent an imminent threat to the public safety. As a result of this order, the full effect of the Controlled Substance Act and its implementing regulations including criminal, civil and administrative penalties, sanctions, and regulatory controls are imposed on the manufacture, distribution, possession, importation, and exportation of these compounds. In the United Kingdom, MDPV is a Class B restricted drug, and is a controlled substance in Finland, Sweden, and Germany.

AI BioTech makes no claims as to the legality or use of the test substances provided for analysis. This report is for informational purposes only. 
were performed on some of the juveniles and the signs and symptoms observed are similar to those of an individual under the influence of marijuana. The officers conducting the D.R.E. examinations on the juvenile probationers who admitted to recent "Spice" use reported that some of the signs and symptoms they observed were high pulse rate, blood shot eyes, reddened conjunctiva, dilated pupils, muscle tremors in the eyelids, legs and abdomen and high blood pressure.


8. In July of 2011 I transferred from the Traffic Section to the Patrol Division and I noticed after I transferred to Patrol that a large number of the calls for service involved individuals that had been utilizing "Bath Salts." On one particular occasion, there was a call that came in involving an altercation. When we responded we found that the altercation involved individuals fighting over "Bath Salts." During the course of that day, we had to respond three separate times regarding these same individuals. This caused us to divert resources that could have been used elsewhere.
9. In January of 2012 I responded to an incident of a female being disorderly outside of one of the establishments on Whiskey Row. When I arrived at the scene I was advised that the subject had been using "Bath Salts." The female subject was lying on the sidewalk screaming and apparently hallucinating. She was unresponsive to questions and acting very paranoid. She ended up having to be transported to Yavapai Regional Medical Center.
10. There are as many, if not more adverse side effects in these synthetic drugs, than there are in their illicit counterparts. In my opinion this makes them as dangerous if not more dangerous than the drugs that are already outlawed.


1. I am a resident of Yavapai County and currently work at Yavapai-Prescott Tribal Police Department as the Director of Police Services.
2. I agree and acknowledge that “designer or synthetic drugs” contain dangerous ingredients (i.e. cannabinoids, cathinones and psilocybin) that are injurious to the residents of Yavapai County.
3. I am aware that these “designer or synthetic drugs” are marketed as, but not limited to the following: “Go Fast,” “Spice,” “Sprinklezz,” “Incense,” “Potpourri,” “Herbal Sachets,” “Glass Cleaner,” “Felt Cleaner,” “Go Fast Carpet Cleaner,” “Exuberance Powder,” “Tickle Talc” and “Bath Salts.”
4. I am aware that these “designer or synthetic drugs” are being purchased for human consumption.

This probationer admitted to ongoing repetitive use of ‘Spice’. She continuously failed to meet probation requirements due to her consumption of alcohol and ‘Spice’ and was eventually returned to jail to complete her original sentence.
8. I am aware of parents named in child welfare cases testing positive for ‘Spice’ and ‘Bath Salts’. The use of designer or synthetic drugs has been detrimental to families causing considerable trauma and stress to the children, some of whom have been displaced into foster care. These children are also victims of designer or synthetic drugs.

9. I am aware that a Tribal business owner has received numerous requests, both in person and by telephone, to sell 'designer or synthetic drugs'. These requests have become bothersome to the owner as they interfere with normal business activities. The owner has posted a sign clearly stating this business does not sell 'designer or synthetic drugs'.






Officers located the man in the middle of the highway blocking traffic. The man was removing his clothing, waving his arms and screaming. Officers were able to secure the man who later advised he had smoked “spice”. Prior to the Officers arrival, a U.S. Forest Service employee had attempted to help the man but was assaulted in the process.
8. On January 21, 2012, while investigating the call of a hit and run accident, the suspect was located by Officers in a local “Smoke Shop”. While arresting the suspect he became combative and had to be physically restrained. During a search of his person, “spice” was located on the suspect.

9. On July 18, 2012, I personally spoke with Administrators from the Chino Valley High School. I was informed that "spice" was confiscated from students on three occasions during the 2011-2012 school year.
10. On several occasions over the past year, Chino Valley Police Officers have located "Spice" during searches of arrestees and/or their vehicles.




1. I am a resident of Yavapai County and currently work at Prescott Police Department as a Lieutenant.
2. I agree and acknowledge that "designer or synthetic drugs" contain dangerous ingredients (i.e. cannabinoids, cathinones and psilocybin) that are injurious to the residents of Yavapai County.
3. I am aware that these "designer or synthetic drugs" are marketed as, but not limited to the following: "Go Fast," "Spice," "Incense," "Potpourri," "Glass Cleaner," "K2," "Black Mamba," and "Bath Salts."
4. I am aware that these "designer or synthetic drugs" are being purchased for human consumption.
5. I am aware, by first-hand knowledge, of certain matters set forth below, that these "designer or synthetic drugs" are injurious, indecent, or offensive to the senses of the residents of Yavapai County and therefore a public nuisance.
6. I have been a police officer in the state of Arizona for 27 years; 6 of which had been with the City of Prescott. I had recently been assigned to the Special Operations Bureau which oversaw the Traffic Enforcement and Investigations Section, among other units, when "spice" first was noted in Arizona, and the affects it had on the users as well as public safety personnel.
7. From my previous experience as an undercover Narcotics Officer with the Mesa Police Department, I have noted the negative effects of people who use synthetic drugs often are enhanced as compared to their illegal drug counterparts.
8. As one of my duties included being the department's spokesperson, I had done research into cases involving "spice" and "bath salts" for articles and stories for the media. I had read several police reports where it was noted that people who were violently ill had admitted to the use of both "spice" and "bath salts." Some of the symptoms that were reported were vomiting, anxiety, paranoia, panic attacks, hallucinations, seizures, and increased heart rate.
9. In conjunction with Juvenile Probation, I arranged for the Prescott Police Department Drug Recognition experts to assist in a study. It was learned that the affects of both "spice and bath salts" were often times greatly more potent than their illegal counterparts and signs of impairment will generally have a longer lasting effect. During interviews, juveniles often commented that they used these synthetic drugs because they would avoid positive drug test screenings.


10. In one known Prescott case (DR 11-39017). A female individual started using "bath salts" that she purchased from the C-Stop, on Miller Valley Rd. in Prescott, and proceeded to write multiple fraudulent checks (stolen from a neighbor and her mother), fraudulent credit card transactions, and even stole a Meals on Wheel donation box from a local restaurant. When a detective arrested her, she had 2 bath salt pipes on her and during her interview she stated that she did what she did because of the drugs and she currently is serving time in the Department of Corrections as a result.
11. As another example, an incident occurred where a juvenile had been reported in the downtown area to be out of control and exhibiting signs of drug impairment. This individual was reported to be yelling, screaming, and appeared paranoid. Upon police arrival, he was lying on the ground vomiting and in a curled up position complaining of large stomach pains. This individual admitted to ingesting spice prior to this episode. He was transported to the hospital for emergency medical treatment.


1. I am a resident of Yavapai County and currently work at Prescott Police Department as Chief of Police.
2. I agree and acknowledge that “designer or synthetic drugs” contain dangerous ingredients (i.e. cannabinoids, cathinones and psilocybin) that are injurious to the residents of Yavapai County.
3. I am aware that these “designer or synthetic drugs” are marketed as, but not limited to the following: “Spice” and “Bath Salts.”
4. I am aware that these “designer or synthetic drugs” are being purchased for human consumption.
5. I am aware, by first-hand knowledge, of certain matters set forth below, that these “designer or synthetic drugs” are injurious, indecent, or offensive to the senses of the residents of Yavapai County and therefore a public nuisance.
6. As the Police Chief for the Prescott Police Department I oversee on average 75 police officers and approximately 30 dispatchers in serving the public safety needs of the residents of Prescott. The population of Prescott is approximately 40,000 individuals. In my capacity as Police Chief I have received numerous complaints from community members regarding the sale of synthetic drugs. Just yesterday I received a call from an individual in which he complained that The Island Store in Prescott is continuing to sell these items covertly from behind the counter.
7. I have also received complaints from family members of individuals who have used these substances who have explained to me the difficulties and emotional harm that these products are causing to their families. Some of these individuals have told me that their family members who have used these synthetic drugs have experienced fungus growing in their mouth, throat and lungs.
8. Individuals using these synthetic drugs create a safety hazard to my officers as they respond to calls involving these individuals. Any time a person is under the influence of either “Spice” or “Bath Salts” their demeanor is unpredictable. Officers have seen various effects that are caused by ingesting these synthetic drugs to include comatose states and active violent aggression.


The individuals taking these substances often are oblivious to reality. This causes the officers safety to be in jeopardy as they deal with these users and at times they have had to take preventative measures by using physical force to restrain them or even Tasing them.

9. Our dispatchers have also been affected by the increase of calls because of these synthetic drugs. Often the calls involve volatile situations and also include possible medical situations. It is difficult for dispatchers to know exactly what steps need to be taken because it is not always clear if it is a law enforcement or medical situation. The time that it takes to respond to these calls ties up lines available for other emergency situations. Responding to calls involving synthetic drugs has put a drain on our dispatchers.
10. Dealing with these synthetic drugs puts a drain on public safety resources for the entire community. Not only do calls regarding these substances require attention from law enforcement officers, it also requires attention from other emergency responders. Once it is determined that "bath salts" or "spice" are the underlying problem, the fire department, ambulance services and emergency medical technicians are often called to assist. Resources are often used to assist family members that are affected by a user of synthetic drugs.
11. Through meetings that I have attended with other Chiefs of Police throughout the State, I have discussed with them the similar effects that they are seeing in their communities. They have also expressed the volatile situations and potentially dangerous conditions that their officers face when responding to situations involving the use of synthetic drugs.
12. My department has also been involved in studies conducted by the Yavapai County Juvenile Department regarding the use of "bath salts" and "spice" by juvenile probationers. It is alarming to see the number of youths using "bath salts" and/or "spice" on a regular basis.
13. It is through concern for our community that I am writing this affidavit. Because the manufacturers of these synthetic drugs are always changing the chemical make-up of these products it is difficult for law enforcement to control or regulate the sale or use of these substances. It is with great concern that I submit this affidavit in order to prevent further injury to the community.

Nancy Gardner, being duly sworn, upon oath deposes and says as follows:

1. I am a resident of Yavapai County and currently work at Camp Verde Marshal’s Office as the Town Marshal. I have been in that position since February, 2012 and in law enforcement since September, 1991 working in the capacity as Officer, Detective, Sergeant and Lieutenant. In addition, I have worked as a Police Commander overseeing SWAT teams and handling potentially critical situations involving illegal drugs and incidences pertaining to drug cartels and organized crimes. Over the course of my career, I have been made aware of many incidences where drugs are the basis of many crimes that occur. I have been an investigator in drug overdose cases that resulted in death and in many cases where drugs have ruined their lives.
2. I agree and acknowledge that “designer or synthetic drugs” contain dangerous ingredients (i.e. cannabinoids, cathinones and psilocybin) that are injurious to the residents of Yavapai County.
3. I am aware that these “designer or synthetic drugs” are marketed as, but not limited to the following: “Spice” and “Bath Salts.”
4. I am aware that these “designer or synthetic drugs” are being purchased for human consumption.
5. I am aware, by first-hand knowledge, of certain matters set forth below, that these “designer or synthetic drugs” are injurious, indecent, or offensive to the senses of the residents of Yavapai County and therefore a public nuisance.
6. I have received numerous reports from my deputies regarding these substances where individuals appear to be under the influence of these synthetic drugs. The symptoms they are seeing are similar to those of LSD and PCP. These individuals appear to have no pain threshold and appear to be in a chemically induced psychotic state.
7. On April 18, 2012 there was a report of a high school student who had admitted to ingesting “Spice.” The individual did admit to using “Spice” earlier the morning of the incident with several other students by the school library. When the students went to class, this particular student asked another student to hit him. Upon being hit, he fell to the ground and while on the ground, he said that he was “so high.” Through the investigation, it was

determined that at least four (4) students had smoked "Spice." (CVMO Y12000670)

8. In February, 2012 officers responded to a call of an unknown disturbance at a residence in Camp Verde. The female at the residence appeared to have fresh needle marks on both arms consistent with intravenous drug use. When she was asked about the needle marks, she stated that the tracks were from pulling blood out of her arms and putting the blood back into her body. She later admitted to using "bath salts." Two young children were located in the residence and the assistance of Child Protective Services (CPS) was requested. The young woman would emotionally cycle from being somewhat quiet to flailing about with her arms while yelling. At one point she appeared to be demonically possessed. The children were taken from the residence by their grandparent. When the deputy went back to the residence with CPS he found two large carving knives lying on the couch and the young woman said that she put the knives there because the shadows were moving. (CVMO V12001472)
9. On July 9, 2012 we received a call of a male acting disorderly and that was disoriented while at the Out of Africa Wildlife Park in Camp Verde. It was reported that this individual had a large laceration on his left arm. Attendants at the Park indicated that the subject was being disruptive and acting irrational. The subject was adamantly requesting to speak with the "Beast Master." When he was contacted by the deputy, he was asked regarding the laceration and he told the deputy that if he told him what happened he would not believe him. He told the deputy that he was there from the beginning of time 6000 years ago. He asked the deputy if he knew Cain and Abel. Eventually, Emergency Medical Service providers arrived at the scene and they advised that the suspect appeared to be experiencing "spice" induced paranoia or delusions. A container was located in the individual's truck that was consistent with the type of containers that contain spice-like substances. The labeling of the container had the name "Kaptain Kush and Potpourri." (CVMO V12006014)
10. I have had additional reports of similar conduct of those mentioned above in which individuals admitted to "spice" or "bath salts" use. There are additional cases in which the behavior observed is misinterpreted as other substances such as alcohol or other illicit drug impairment.
11. Recently I received a visit from the owner of the Wes Lance Trading Company in Camp Verde. He asked me what my position was on the sale of "bath salts" and "spice." After a brief conversation, I asked him why he doesn't stop selling "spice" and he responded, "you are asking me to shut my doors and go out of business." He said "my employees have families to feed." At that point, he was advised that he needed to be aware that it was his responsibility to make sure what he is selling is legal and if not he will be


subject to enforcement action. He indicated that he believed the major drug organizations are behind the promotion of making these items illegal because these substances are eating away at their profits.

12. The behaviors of individuals under the influence of synthetic drugs is very unpredictable and poses a threat to officers, citizens and themselves based on the paranoid and delusional state that they are in while under the influence. It takes additional resources away from my department in order to investigate and at times restrain these individuals because of their violent tendencies.



1. I am a resident of Yavapai County and currently work at the U.S. Forest Service as a law enforcement officer.
2. I agree and acknowledge that “designer or synthetic drugs” contain dangerous ingredients (i.e. cannabinoids, cathinones and psilocybin) that are injurious to the residents of Yavapai County.
3. I am aware that these “designer or synthetic drugs” are marketed as, but not limited to the following: “Spice” and “Bath Salts.”
4. I am aware that these “designer or synthetic drugs” are being purchased for human consumption.
5. I am aware, by first-hand knowledge, of certain matters set forth below, that these “designer or synthetic drugs” are injurious, indecent, or offensive to the senses of the residents of Yavapai County and therefore a public nuisance.
6. In Spring, 2012 I heard over dispatch that an individual had called 911 ten or eleven times regarding a possible assault and possible rape and this individual was located near the Bullpen Campground area near the town of Camp Verde. I responded to that area in order to assist Sheriff’s deputies. When I was about one mile from the campground, I saw an individual walking through the forest, no shirt on, his hair was completely disheveled, who had cuts and scrapes all over his body. His eyes were extremely red and bloodshot. When I made contact with this individual he said that someone had raped his daughter but when I questioned him further there were many inconsistencies in his statements. Every time a car would pass by, he would say that’s the car that raped my daughter. When I asked him about the cuts and scrapes he said that someone had beat him up. I suspected this individual was under some form of illicit drugs. He first denied drug use but then admitted that he used “Bath Salts” with some individuals who were camping next to him and that he used them because he thought they were legal. He said he was scared because of the way these synthetic drugs were making him feel and he adamantly expressed that they should be illegal. He said that he had been on methamphetamine for 12 years and that “Bath Salts” are worse than methamphetamine. I eventually located the area where he was camping and I spoke with a teenage male who said that he was this man’s son. When I asked him about the possible rape of his sister, the son replied that he does not have


a sister and that he is the only child. I asked him about being beat up and the son said his dad is out of it and that he just took off running through the bushes and the rocks. A few hours after this incident I heard another call come through dispatch in which a 14 year old male was driving his unconscious dad out of the Bullpen Campground area.

7. I responded to a call on the Sycamore Canyon Road just outside of Clarkdale. The call was regarding a stolen vehicle and I went to the area to assist deputies of the Sheriff's office in an attempt to locate the vehicle. We received information regarding a couple that may have been involved in the theft of the vehicle. I saw a couple walking down Sycamore Canyon Road that fit the description of the information given. When I spoke with the couple, they indicated that they were going to go camping in this area and that they decided to celebrate their anniversary by experimenting with "Bath Salts." The only camping equipment, if you can call it camping equipment, they had was two pieces of dirty carpet, boxed wine, an assortment of Little Debbie snack cakes, vials of "Bath Salts" and stolen tools.







1. I am a resident of Yavapai County and currently work at Yavapai County Sheriff's Office as Deputy and have been in that position approximately four (4) years.
2. I agree and acknowledge that "designer or synthetic drugs" contain dangerous ingredients (i.e. cannabinoids, cathinones and psilocybin) that are injurious to the residents of Yavapai County.
3. I am aware that these "designer or synthetic drugs" are marketed as, but not limited to the following: "Go Fast," "Spice," "Sprinklezz," "Incense," "Potpourri," "Herbal Sachets," "Glass Cleaner," "Go Fast Carpet Cleaner," "Exuberance Powder," and "Bath Salts."
4. I am aware that these "designer or synthetic drugs" are being purchased for human consumption.
5. I am aware, by first-hand knowledge, of certain matters set forth below, that these "designer or synthetic drugs" are injurious, indecent, or offensive to the senses of the residents of Yavapai County and therefore a public nuisance.
6. In the Spring of 2011 I was headed to training and I was travelling southbound on Hwy 77 north of Taylor, Arizona. I had just passed through a construction zone in which there was one lane of traffic and I was following a pilot car. Just as I passed the end of the construction zone, I noticed a van travelling at a high rate of speed in the opposite lane of traffic. I thought to myself, this van is going to run into the back of the semi-truck that was immediately in front of it. At the last second, the van swerved and hit the back driver side corner of the semi-truck. This caused the van to roll onto its driver's side and it collided with my patrol unit. I was able to react just prior to it colliding with me and was able to swerve to avoid the van hitting me head on. The van hit the back of my patrol unit and caused extensive damage. The driver of the van was contacted by other law enforcement in the area and he admitted to smoking "bath salts" earlier that day and he did not remember much prior to the accident. This caused approximately \$11,000 in damage to my patrol unit and it caused me to have whip lash. If I had not had driver's training courses due to my profession and been alert to my surroundings just prior to this happening, this could have led to a potentially fatal collision.


7. In December of 2011 I responded to a call of an individual disturbing the peace and making threatening remarks at a hotel in the Village of Oak Creek. The front desk employee at the hotel stated the subject was threatening to kill him. He also indicated that the subject had a knife on him. As soon as we approached the subject he started screaming that he is going to kill all of us and was making outlandish statements. Once we finally got him handcuffed and placed in the back of the patrol car he tried to kick out the window of the patrol car and had to be placed in RIPP restraints. At one point the suspect kicked me in the leg. He continued to make threatening remarks; he even threatened to go after the other deputies' families and to kill and rape their families. A search was conducted of a back pack that was in his possession and in the back pack there was a marijuana pipe, some beer and some blueberry "Potpourri". Later on we received a call that this individual had stabbed a co-worker earlier in the night but the victim did not want to pursue charges.

8. In July of 2012, we received a call in which the reporting party indicated their family member was threatening to kill himself. The reporting party indicated that the individual had previously been addicted to methamphetamine and was currently addicted to "Bath Salts." When we approached the residence we could hear a male screaming and no one came to the door when we knocked. We yelled out that we were going to knock the door down and this is when the suspect came out of the house and he appeared to be calm. When we attempted to restrain him, due to the threats he made to kill himself, he started to go crazy and threatened to kill us. After the subject was placed in hand cuffs, he resisted arrest and had unexpected strength for an individual his size. We did a protective sweep of the residence and within his bedroom there were strange notes strewn throughout the bedroom. The reporting party indicated that the subject was addicted to "Bath Salts" and the subject had not slept for 2 or 3 days. The suspect was taken to the hospital where he continued to act crazy and started to take his clothing off. After being in the hospital for a couple hours, he started to calm down and I then handcuffed him to take him to jail. At this point he remained calm and actually apologized for his behavior earlier and said, when I take these "Bath Salts," it makes me crazy.







Lucas Wilcoxson, being duly sworn, upon oath deposes and says as follows:

1. I am a resident of Yavapai County and currently work at Sedona Police Department as a Sergeant. I have been employed with the Sedona Police Department for fifteen (15) years. For the last year and a half, I have been assigned to the Partners Against Narcotics Trafficking (P.A.N.T.) Task Force as a Supervisor. I was previously assigned to P.A.N.T. for an additional period of two years.
2. I agree and acknowledge that “designer or synthetic drugs” contain dangerous ingredients (i.e. cannabinoids, cathinones and psilocybin) that are injurious to the residents of Yavapai County.
3. I am aware that these “designer or synthetic drugs” are marketed as, but not limited to the following: “Spice,” “Bath Salts,” “Diablo,” Sparkles,” “Fear Loafing,” and “Funky Monkey.”
4. I am aware that these “designer or synthetic drugs” are being purchased for human consumption, although they are frequently labeled “not for human consumption.”
5. I am aware, by first-hand knowledge, of certain matters set forth below, that these “designer or synthetic drugs” are injurious, indecent, or offensive to the senses of the residents of Yavapai County and therefore a public nuisance.
6. In October 2011, two brothers in Cottonwood, Arizona, who were addicted to methamphetamine, were assisting law enforcement as material informants. During my interaction with these material informants, they told me that they had tried “Bath Salts” once. The material informants stated that after consuming “Bath Salts,” they both felt an uncontrollable rage, which resulted in them assaulting each other and destroying their apartment. Based on this negative experience, both material informants state that they will not consume “Bath Salts” again.
7. In January 2012, I interviewed a 19-year-old male who was arrested while high on “Bath Salts.” This individual stated to me that after consuming “Bath Salts,” he felt that he could accomplish anything and had a lot of energy. He also stated that feelings of uncontrollable rage and anger were a negative effect of “Bath Salts.” He stated that he would frequently be happy one


moment and filled with anger the next, with the cycle repeating itself while he was under the influence of "Bath Salts."

8. In early 2012, I was participating in an undercover purchase of "Spice" from a retail store in Cottonwood, Arizona. When asked for the best "Spice" the store had, the retail employee reached under the counter and presented me with "Funky Monkey X20." The retail employee stated that "Funky Monkey X20" would cause a person to feel like as if they were having a heart attack. When asked why it was kept under the counter, the retail employee stated that "Funky Money X20" was only for experienced "Spice" users who could handle an intense effect.
9. Based on my experience as a P.A.N.T. Task Force Supervisor and as a Sergeant with the Sedona Police Department, I know that "designer or synthetic drugs" consume a great amount of law enforcement resources and create a huge community safety risk.






9. The suspect was transported to Yavapai Regional Medical Center (YRMC) West Campus, in Prescott, Arizona. The suspect was placed in critical care. After arriving at YRMC, although he was unconscious, the suspect would flail his arms and ball his fists. The suspect was ultimately sedated for the safety of medical staff and himself. The suspect was later identified as Calvin J. Forrey.
10. In a later interview, the individual whose vehicle was stolen reported that Calvin had been camping next to this individual. This individual encountered Calvin the evening before his vehicle was stolen. At that time, Calvin seemed normal and calm. Calvin made a reference to "bath salts" and "partying" during a conversation with this individual. This individual interpreted Calvin's comment as offering "bath salts," although the individual did not observe any "bath salts" and declined Calvin's offer.
11. This individual reported that, on the morning of June 29, 2012, Calvin came into his campsite screaming about "hostages" and asking to "keep them away from me." Calvin was then observed thrashing in the other camper's vehicle and jumping on top of the vehicle, then laying down and taking off all his clothing. Once naked, Calvin started the vehicle and drove away through the heavily wooded and rugged area where there is no road. Shortly thereafter, the individual heard the vehicle hit a tree and Calvin yelling "get them off me" or "get them away from me." This individual reported being scared for his own safety based on Calvin's actions.
12. Catherine Forrey, Calvin's mother, reported in an interview that she was aware of Calvin's recent bath salt use. Catherine stated that approximately a year before this incident, Calvin had sought treatment for his bath salt addiction at a treatment center in Cottonwood. Catherine stated that, when Calvin is using "bath salts," she "didn't know who [he] was anymore" and that "[i]t was horrible to be anywhere near him and he was destroying [her] whole house." Catherine described Calvin's actions on "bath salts" including frequently taking things apart, using glow in the dark paint and glue, talking about drugs and drug type movies, acting paranoid, and stating that he wants to kill himself and his father whom Calvin believed was hiding on the roof. Catherine reported that Calvin frequently heard voices and thought people under the house or in the attic were coming for him, including one instance where Calvin was convinced the voices he was hearing were his mother talking to him through the walls.
13. When Calvin's actions at Lynx Lake were described to Catherine, she stated she was certain he was under the influence of "bath salts." Catherine had recently been concerned about Calvin's bath salt use. On June 25, 2012, Catherine confronted Calvin about her concerns. Catherine stated that she was afraid of Calvin during this incident and called 911. YCSO responded to this incident, which is detailed in YCSO DR No. 12-020171.
14. An aunt of Calvin stated that the behavior described in the incident on June 29, 2012, was the same as behaviors she had witnessed when Calvin had been on "bath salts" previously.

15. Calvin's aunt and Catherine both reported finding email correspondence and receipts in Calvin's belongings for the purchase of "bath salts" from foreign countries. Catherine also found a business card for Xhale Smoke Shop, located in Prescott Valley, Arizona.
16. On June 24, 2012, Calvin's father confronted Calvin about his bath salt use. Calvin's father gave Calvin an ultimatum: treatment for Calvin's bath salt addiction or no contact with his father. Calvin told his father that he was not interested in stopping using bath salts. Calvin stated that he felt "bath salts" were ok because they were legal.
17. Calvin also told his father that he had purchased "bath salts" from Woody's on White Spar in Prescott, Arizona, and knew of other places in Yavapai County that "bath salts" were sold over the counter. Calvin admitted to his father that he purchased "bath salts" both locally and overseas.
18. On July 1, 2012, Calvin died while at YRMC. A subsequent autopsy of Calvin's body showed scratches covering his entire body, likely caused by rolling on the ground and running through bushes naked. Calvin's cause of death remains undetermined, pending the results of the toxicology report.
19. A blood sample was obtained during the autopsy of Calvin on July 1, 2012. This sample was analyzed at AIT Laboratories. The results of the analysis indicated the presence of Alpha-PVP and the stimulant caffeine in the blood specimen. Alpha-PVP is a substance that is commonly referred to as "bath salts."





10. In November, 2011, the Cottonwood Police Department responded to a medical emergency at the Cottonwood Middle School. A juvenile had brought bath salts to the school, where he and other middle school students ingested the substance. The middle school students were transported to the hospital due to high body temperatures, profuse sweating, and paranoia. This incident required a response by police, ambulance, and fire, which disrupted the school day of the middle school and nearby elementary school. Cottonwood Police Department DR No. 11-014012.
11. Also in late 2011, a former fighter in the Verde Valley, Arizona, area was arrested for shoplifting from Walmart in Cottonwood, Arizona. During an interview, the subject stated that he was addicted to bath salts. He stated that he was kicked out of his house after he began using bath salts and had been staying at Walmart at night because he had nowhere else to live. When contacted by police, he had over \$500.00 worth of stolen items on his person. The subject stated that the stolen items would be used to purchase bath salts because the money he made through his 40-hour a week employment was not enough to fund his addiction. Cottonwood Police Department DR No. 11-015446.
12. In 2012, the Department responded to a subject who had been brought into the hospital on a bath salt overdose. The subject was placed in an intensive care room, where he attacked the nurses and destroyed medical equipment. After attempting other methods to calm the subject down, responding officers pepper sprayed him. Due to the dangerous behavior of the subject, the subject was ultimately placed in a medical coma until all traces of the drug were eliminated. This incident resulted in over \$15,500.00 in damage and required the hospital to shut down a portion of the intensive care area for cleaning and repair.
13. I am also a member of MATFORCE, a community organization striving to eliminate substance abuse, and a member of an exploratory committee for a local youth facility. In my role as a member of both these organizations, I have received information and discussed the negative impact "designer or synthetic drugs" has had and continues to have on the youth of Yavapai County.
14. I am aware that the citizens of Yavapai County are deeply concerned about retail stores selling "designer or synthetic drugs." I observed a peaceful protest in front of a Cottonwood retail store known in the community to sell spice and bath salts. The protest included citizens involved in the boys and girls club, a church, and local business owners.
15. Each day we allow retail stores to continue to sell these "designer or synthetic drugs," law enforcement resources are being strained and harm is coming to the citizens of Yavapai County.



1. I am a resident of Yavapai County and currently work at the Prescott Area Narcotic Tasks Force as an undercover narcotics agent.
2. I agree and acknowledge that “designer or synthetic drugs” contain dangerous ingredients (i.e. cannabinoids, cathinones and psilocybin) that are injurious to the residents of Yavapai County.
3. I am aware that these “designer or synthetic drugs” are marketed as, but not limited to the following: “Go Fast,” “Spice,” “Sprinklezz,” “Incense,” “Potpourri,” “Herbal Sachets,” “Glass Cleaner,” “Felt Cleaner,” “Go Fast Carpet Cleaner,” “Exuberance Powder,” “Tickle Talc” and “Bath Salts.”
4. I am aware that these “designer or synthetic drugs” are being purchased for human consumption.
5. I am aware, by first-hand knowledge, of certain matters set forth below, that these “designer or synthetic drugs” are injurious, indecent, or offensive to the senses of the residents of Yavapai County and therefore a public nuisance.
6. On July 16, 2012, an undercover operation was done at numerous retail locations and I purchased “G-6 Watermelon spice/Potpourri” for \$11.00 from the Prescott Quick Stop at 447 S. Montezuma Street in Prescott. The items were not in plain view – under the counter.
7. On July 25, 2012, an undercover operation was done at the Wes Lance Trading Company, 873 Howards Road, Camp Verde, Arizona. During this operation one package of “Mr. Nice Guy STRONG Potpourri” was purchased. This item was located in plain view. The “potpourri” was on a rack behind the counter. This item was sent to the Drug Enforcement Administration lab for testing. (YCSO Reports 12-023688 and 12-024707)



The suspect was subsequently charged for second degree homicide, aggravated assault, endangerment, and criminal damage. The case is currently pending in Yavapai County Superior Court.

7. On May 24, 2012, Prescott Narcotics detectives assisted Arizona Department of Public Safety Highway Patrol Officers McFarland and Soto with a traffic stop on Interstate 17 Milepost 268 northbound, which is north of Cordes Junction, Arizona. The vehicle was stopped for erratic driving and extreme hazard to other motorists on Interstate 17. Officer McFarland contacted the driver and passenger of the vehicle who had extremely bizarre behavior. Officer McFarland attempted to have a conversation with the occupants of the vehicle and had a very difficult time. The driver and passenger were ultimately transported to the Verde Valley Medical Center for reports of difficulty breathing and a possible heart attack. An inventory of the vehicle revealed ten vials of tan powder substance in a cigarette pack. The substance was field tested for methamphetamine, heroin, cocaine and other illegal substances which were all negative. Officers then located ten opened/empty wrappers for "AMPED exuberance powder 2-ladybug attractant". It was determined that the vials were removed from the packages and identified as a form of "bath salts".

Further investigation revealed that both occupants of the vehicle admitted to use of "bath salts" and that the drugs had caused the difficulty breathing and possible heart attack symptoms. The passenger in the vehicle advised that he has been a long time methamphetamine user and the effects of "bath salts" are far worse than any methamphetamine he has ever used. The driver of the vehicle was subsequently charged with Driving Under the Influence of Drugs.

The vials were sent to the Arizona Department of Public Safety Crime Laboratory for analysis. Results are pending.

8. On August 7, 2012, Prescott Narcotics detectives assisted Arizona Department of Public Safety Highway Patrol Officer B. Merritt with a traffic collision involving injury on State Route 69 Milepost 295 northbound. The traffic collision involved five vehicles and six injured subjects. The determining factor in the traffic collision appears as one vehicle was traveling at a high rate of speed approaching several vehicles stopped or slowed within the traffic lanes. The vehicle at a high rate of speed was unable to stop prior to colliding with the four vehicles. The driver of the at fault vehicle was transported to the Flagstaff Medical Center for head injuries via medical helicopter and the other five individuals were treated and released for injuries.

An inventory of the at fault vehicle revealed nine separate vials/jars of "spice". Five of the vials/jars are "Legal Devil X potpourri" with the admonishment of "not for human consumption" and the other four vials/jars are "SYN XXX" with the admonishment of "not for human consumption". In

addition to the vials/jars, a receipt for Smoke and Thingz located at 6350 Hwy 69 Ste. B, Prescott Valley, Arizona dated August 7, 2012 at 11:25 AM for \$134.19 was located in the bag containing the vials/jars. A business card for Smoke N Thingz with the same address and owner of Geoff Russell was located in the vehicle. Further investigation revealed a debit card issued to the driver of the at fault vehicle was used to purchase the "spice" items from Smoke N Thingz.

Evidence was collected from the driver of the at fault vehicle and is pending analysis. Officers are requesting charges from the Yavapai County Attorney's Office for aggravated assault, endangerment, criminal damage, and driving under the influence of drugs.

9. I have been employed by the Arizona Department of Public Safety as a sworn law enforcement officer for over twenty years and working narcotics for approximately seventeen years. Officers and detectives have observed more incidents involving death and injury over the past two years as a result of "spice" and "bath salts". Suspects that use these substances are unpredictable and dangerous which in turn make them a danger to the public. There is a prevalent notion that because the substances are not illegal that they are safe to use especially with juveniles and young adults. The wide spread impact of this myth has resulted in an increase in the use of these particular substances.

Persons under the influence of "spice" and "bath salts" are functioning within society, frequenting public areas and utilizing the highways at which time they are a risk to themselves and anyone else around them as their behavior is erratic and unpredictable.



Affidavit of Yavapai County Sheriff Scott Mascher –

I, Scott Mascher, Sheriff of Yavapai County, acknowledge the trend involving synthetic drug use and abuse in Yavapai County presents a grave health and safety risk. Based on my research, training, and expertise, it is very apparent the addictive nature of these substances, along with the exponential danger to the health of the user's body, creates an urgent need for law enforcement's pro-active response.

I am aware the designer, or synthetic drugs, contain dangerous ingredients and are marketed under names such as "Go Fast," "Spice," "Sprinklezz," "Incense," "Potpourri," "Herbal Sachets," "Glass Cleaner," "Felt Cleaner," "Go Fast Carpet Cleaner," and "Bath Salts."

At least two recent significant incidents support my concerns –

June of 2012 – Deputies arrived at a home in Prescott Valley in response to a report involving an unresponsive 13-year-old. When deputies contacted the boy, he was acting paranoid and grabbed a deputy's arm with such force it almost tore the deputy's watch off. Medical personnel treated the boy who had twice passed out in their presence. Deputies learned the boy had smoked "Spice," aka synthetic marijuana, which was provided by an adult who purchased the drug from a business in Prescott Valley. (DR 12-018683).

June of 2012 – Deputies were called to the Lynx Lake area just outside of Prescott regarding a nude man who had just stolen a vehicle from a campsite. Prior to the deputy's arrival, the man crashed the vehicle into a tree. The man refused to cooperate with the first deputy on scene. During an attempt to subdue the violent individual, the deputy used his "Taser" stun gun which had little impact on the man's resistance. A second deputy arrived and was able to assist and handcuff the man. It was learned the man had likely used "bath salts" and had a prior addiction to bath salts based on previous law enforcement contact. The man later died in the hospital. Medical Examiner results are still pending. (DR 12-021820).

There have also been recent incidents of extremely dangerous driving behavior involving those under the influence of synthetic drugs. As with the above incidents, the effects tend to manifest themselves in the user's irrational, and many times, violent behavior.


Commander Bill Suttle, who oversees the Partner's Against Narcotics Trafficking (PANT) task force, has told me that many serious "analog" drug users will avoid using these synthetics because of the risk involved. Suttle is personally aware of methamphetamine addicts who draw the line at synthetic drug use because of the inherent danger and in some cases, unknown side effects of the drugs.


These examples are typical of what my deputies are confronting around the County which are affecting young and old alike. I strongly support efforts to educate our residents regarding this dangerous trend in synthetic drug use. I also support efforts to eradicate the availability of these drugs in an over the counter capacity.





1. I am a resident of Yavapai County and currently work at Yavapai County Juvenile Probation as Juvenile Detention Manager and have been in that position for 12 years.
2. I agree and acknowledge that “designer or synthetic drugs” contain dangerous ingredients (i.e. cannabinoids, cathinones and psilocybin) that are injurious to the residents of Yavapai County.
3. I am aware that these “designer or synthetic drugs” are marketed as, but not limited to the following: “Spice,” “Incense,” “Potpourri,” “Glass Cleaner,” and “Bath Salts.”
4. I am aware that these “designer or synthetic drugs” are being purchased for human consumption.
5. I am aware, by first-hand knowledge, of certain matters set forth below, that these “designer or synthetic drugs” are injurious, indecent, or offensive to the senses of the residents of Yavapai County and therefore a public nuisance.
6. We have had several juveniles admitted into the Yavapai County Juvenile Detention Center that have been under the influence of either “Spice” or “Bath Salts” or both. When these juveniles come into the facility, they go through a detoxification (detox) program and we have seen extreme effects caused by these drugs. One of the most severe symptoms that we see is a chemically induced psychosis from the juvenile. In every single case during the detox process, these juveniles have indicated that they are hearing voices. These voices are demonic, negative and destructive. We have to put these juveniles in some form of isolation before they can be introduced into the general population. At times we have to restrain the juvenile, to protect them from themselves. These restraint periods can last from 10 minutes up to 2 hours depending on the severity of the psychosis.
7. We also see that the juvenile experiences aches, pains, thirst and deprivation of sleep during this detox period. It takes between three days to two weeks, dealing with the juvenile on a one to one basis, before they can be introduced into the general population. The effects caused by “Bath Salts” are much more severe than those caused by “Spice.” The detox for both of these


substances is as bad or worse than juvenile's detoxing from illicit drugs such as cocaine and methamphetamine.

8. Even after a juvenile has gone through the initial detox period, they are continuing to experience chemically induced psychosis that lasts three (3) months or longer. While these juveniles are experiencing this chemically induced psychosis, it makes it difficult to supervise them because their behavior can be very unpredictable and erratic. Several of the juveniles have experienced severe anxiety in which the juvenile has described that they felt like the world was conspiring against them, and this causes them to have a uncontrolled negative psychotic episode. On one particular occasion, there was a juvenile in the general population who had not ingested "Bath Salts" for at least 2 months who experienced a sudden melt down while he was participating in an educational activity. The juvenile was scared and he thought somebody was actively trying to harm him. He felt the need for flight from this non-existent person watching him and he had to be restrained due to that psychotic episode.
9. After juveniles have been off of these substances for some time, they are relating that they are afraid of what these substances have done to their bodies and are afraid of being exposed to these drugs again. It is difficult to treat juveniles on these substances because they cannot be administered psychiatric medications due to the unknown reactions that these medications cause when interacting with these drugs.
10. I have seen how these substances have destroyed the minds of several of these juveniles. It is my experience the use of these substances is likely creating long term damage to these juvenile's brain development which may be irreparable.

One in particular had recurring episodes in which he claimed to be hallucinating. During these episodes he would become violent, and always had to be restrained by more than one detention officer. The after effects of this drug are unknown, but the episodes continued to happen long after the drug was out of his system.

7. 6. As an Adult Probation Officer, I was assigned a new case where the defendant claimed to have abused “Bath Salts” for a period of six months. He stated that he would cook it, filter it through Q-Tips and then inject the substance, like heroin. During the six months he was using this substance, he

claimed to have felt depressed, suffered from many mood swings and would have no appetite.



He told me he had vegetation growing on his heart and he had to have a valve replaced. He also had to have a pacemaker placed in his chest. He spent slightly over a month in the hospital. Even after discharge from the hospital, the defendant had to be on a blood thinner and loved ones reported he had a couple of seizures.



1. I am a resident of Yavapai County and am currently employed as a Deputy Director of Juvenile Court at Yavapai County Juvenile Probation Department.
2. I agree and acknowledge that “designer or synthetic drugs” contain dangerous ingredients (i.e. cannabinoids, cathinones and psilocybin) that are injurious to the residents of Yavapai County.
3. I am aware, by first-hand knowledge, of certain matters set forth below and that these “designer or synthetic drugs” are injurious, indecent, or offensive to the senses of the Residences of Yavapai County, therefore constitute a public nuisance.
4. In December 2010, the Yavapai County Juvenile Probation Department examined the use and effect of the “designer or synthetic drug” commonly referred to as “spice” on Yavapai County’s juvenile probation population. This examination included obtaining information on the side effects of “spice” use, which included difficulty breathing, high body temperature, headaches, and feeling a high level of anxiety and panic.
5. In the past year, the Yavapai County Juvenile Probation Department has seen a rise in odd behaviors by probationees in detention, including self-harming and erratic behaviors that frequently require the probationee to be secured due to safety concerns and/or require a psych evaluation. These behaviors are believed to be the effect of “designer or synthetic drugs.”
6. From January 29, 2012, through February 4, 2012, the Yavapai County Juvenile Probation Department examined the use and effect of the “designer or synthetic drug” commonly referred to as “bath salts” on Yavapai County’s juvenile probation population. This examination was initiated due to the reported popularity of “bath salt” use in Yavapai County by probationees, specifically in Prescott and Cottonwood. This popularity was, in part, due to urinalysis tests being unable or unlikely to positively identify “bath salt” chemicals.
7. During the examination of “bath salt” use, all juveniles who came into the probation office were required to submit a sample for urinalysis testing and were interviewed as to their knowledge and/or use of “bath salts.” One hundred and five urine samples were obtained and tested. All of the urine samples were negative for “bath salts.” It is unknown whether the negative results are attributed to lack of “bath salt” consumption by juvenile probationees or an inability for the analysis to cover all potential chemical compounds that make up “bath salts.”
8. In total, 138 juveniles were interviewed about their knowledge and/or use of “bath salts.” Of this group, 27% did admit to experimentation with “bath salts.” A few of the juvenile probationees admitted that experimentation with “bath salts” resulted in a horrible addiction to the drugs. Out of the 138 juveniles interviewed, 52 of them stated that


friends, peers, and family members use “bath salts.” When asked why they experimented with “bath salts,” the juveniles frequently responded that they were able to get high without the danger of urinalysis testing positive, peer pressure to try “bath salts,” and it was something to do.

9. Additionally, during the examination of juvenile probationee use of “bath salts,” 74 of the urine samples were tested for “spice.” Of this sample, 32% tested positive.
10. I have observed “bath salts” being sold at the front counter of a downtown Prescott, Arizona, candy shop, alongside candy and tobacco products. It appeared that these “bath salts” were being marketed to a juvenile population.
11. I also act as a CASA for the dependency court system in Prescott, Arizona. In that capacity, I am aware of cases where ingestion of “bath salts” by parents contributed greatly to abuse and neglect of children.
12. Each day we allow retail stores to continue to sell these “designer or synthetic drugs,” law enforcement resources are being strained and harm is coming to the citizens of Yavapai County.

Dear Ms. Polk,

Between the dates of January 29, 2012 and February 4, 2012 the Yavapai County Juvenile Probation Department collaborated with the Prescott Police Department, the Cottonwood Police Department, the Yavapai County Sheriff's Office, and the Department of Public Safety to examine the use and effects of bath salts in our juvenile probation population. In addition to bath salts we tested for other drugs including spice and prescription medications/opiates. The probation officers and police officers conducted interviews on a total of 138 juveniles. In addition they gave 105 juveniles urinalysis test for bath salts and other drugs. The juveniles were evaluated and tested while in detention, coming to court, randomly in the probation offices (Prescott and Cottonwood) and in their homes.

In summary, none of the juveniles we tested for baths salts came back positive for the drug. Through the interview process 27% or 37 of the juveniles admitted to experimenting with the drug/bath salts, in the past. We also tested 74 juveniles for spice and 32% of those kids actually tested positive for the drug being in their system. The juveniles in our system have turned to baths salts and spice because testing has been historically very expensive and until recently was not available at all. The interviews indicated that many of the juveniles stopped using bath salts because of the dramatic physical effects that it had on them. Because the results indicated no positive tests for bath salts I am somewhat skeptical that the chemical compounds tested were correct. These synthetic drugs continue to be a moving target and we always seem to be one step behind. It is clear, however, that the use of spice is still very prevalent with our population of youth and we need to continue to do more to curb the use of all synthetic drugs.

We appreciate the support of MATForce and the County Attorney's Office in making this task force happen. The information gleaned through these efforts is invaluable for our work in the future. We are hopeful that this information will lead to increased education and legislation outlawing this harmful drug.

4. I am aware that these “designer or synthetic drugs” are being purchased for human consumption.
5. I am aware, by first-hand knowledge, of certain matters set forth below, that these “designer or synthetic drugs” are injurious, indecent, or offensive to the senses of the residents of Yavapai County and therefore a public nuisance.
6. Many local former young students and young adults have become addicted to these designer, synthetic drugs and now are facing sentences along with rehabilitation needs. My greatest fear is that students in grades eight and down will begin to experiment with these drugs in Yavapai County.






1. I am a resident of Yavapai County..

7. At the beginning of 2012, I started using “Bath Salts.” I primarily purchased my “Bath Salts” from X-Hale Smoke Shop, Mario’s Mini Mart and the C Stop Convenience Store. When I used “Bath Salts” it gave me similar feelings as when I used cocaine. I would feel an initial increase in energy but then I would start getting hallucinations and paranoia. I would feel like the cops were constantly after me. It also caused me to have feelings of depression. The hallucinations and paranoia were similar to those caused by the consumption of methamphetamine.
8. I have used several forms of illicit drugs in the past including heroin, cocaine, crack cocaine, methamphetamine and opiate pain killers. I find “Bath Salts” to be more addictive than all of these except for maybe heroin. I started turning to “Bath Salts” instead of other drugs because they were very easy to get and they were being marketed as non-illegal or harmful. I saw several

people whose lives were severely impacted from the consumption of these dangerous synthetic drugs including individuals that lost their minds.





4. I am aware that these “designer or synthetic drugs” are being purchased for human consumption.
5. I am aware, by first-hand knowledge, of certain matters set forth below, that these “designer or synthetic drugs” are injurious, indecent, or offensive to the senses of the residents of Yavapai County and therefore a public nuisance.
6. I first tried “Bath Salts” in December of 2011. I purchased a “Bath Salt” product that is being sold or marketed under the name of “Amped” from the X-Hale Smoke Shop in Prescott Valley, Arizona.
7. I used “Bath Salts” from December, 2011 through March, 2012. I used a number of products during this time including “Go Fast Carpet Cleaner”, “Eight Ballz” and “Amped.” I purchased these products from a number of different retailers within Yavapai County.
8. The way I consumed these products is through intravenous injections. I would at first feel an initial high of warmth and body tingling. I would then have visual stimulation then audio and visual hallucinations from using the product. The hallucinations would include walls caving in on me, the floor coming up at me and people’s faces would start appearing demonic. I would lose my ability to communicate and rationalize. These intense sensations would last approximately 30 – 45 minutes depending on the product.

9. After the initial reaction, I would still feel the effects for at least six (6) hours after ingesting the product. I would then become very drowsy, disoriented and confused. I would still have hallucinations during this time.
10. When I would first inject myself with "Bath Salts" I would feel the urge to use again about every four (4) hours and often times I would then use again. Most times I would use for a period of one or two days every four (4) hours then I would not use for three to five days. During the time I was not using, I would be very irritable and agitated.
11. I have used a number of illicit drugs to include PCP, heroin, methamphetamine, cocaine, opioids, marijuana, LSD, mushrooms, ecstasy and peyote. I have ingested these through various means to include snorting, intravenous injections, oral ingestion and smoking. "Bath Salts" are as addictive and much more dangerous to any of these drugs listed.
12. I would say that "Bath Salts" are dangerous because you lose a total sense of reality and comprehension. It has severe physical effects on your body including weight loss, rise in body temperature, bad chest pains, high blood pressure, shortness of breath, sweating profusely and elevated heart rate. On one occasion because of these severe symptoms I experienced, I had to admit myself to the Emergency Room of Yavapai Regional Medical Center - East.



5. I am aware, by first-hand knowledge, of certain matters set forth below, that these “designer or synthetic drugs” are injurious, indecent, or offensive to the senses of the residents of Yavapai County and therefore a public nuisance.
6. I started using “Bath Salts” in 2011. I first used in Utah and then I moved back to Prescott Valley. I would travel to Phoenix to purchase “Bath Salts.” I then discovered that stores in the Prescott area were selling “Bath Salts” and “Spice.” Most often I would purchase these products from Mario’s Mini Mart in Prescott Valley. The X-Hale Smoke Shop then opened up and I would purchase from the Mario’s Mini Mart or the X-Hale Smoke Shop depending on price.
7. I would ingest “Bath Salts” either by smoking or by snorting. At times I would mix “Spice” and “Bath Salts” together. I would use about four (4) grams of “Bath Salts” a day.
8. When I first ingested “Bath Salts” I would have rapid speech, heightened awareness and a lot of energy. Then after about 24 hours my body would crash and I would have no energy at all but could not sleep and I would usually go days without sleep. I would experience intense hallucinations in which I would think people were following me and I thought these people were either law enforcement or individuals I knew. It felt like I was being investigated and part of a conspiracy and that everyone was against me. At the time, I knew that this was farfetched but it seemed like it was real.


Because it seemed so real, I felt like I needed to take extreme measures to protect myself and my children, even if it meant resorting to violence. Most of the time I could not leave my room, for fear I was being followed.

9. These episodes of paranoia and hallucinations would cause me to have anxiety attacks. I went to a crisis counselor a number of times because I knew what I was experiencing was not healthy and I had a sense of helplessness. I would deny being under the influence of these synthetic drugs and I was convinced they were not a factor. It was not until I was sober, that I realized these were the sole factor.
10. After consuming "White Rapids" in 2012 which I purchased from the X-Hale Smoke Shop I lost consciousness and I had to be taken to the hospital. While at the hospital, I found out I was pregnant and I made a decision to become sober at that point.
11. I have used several forms of illicit drugs in the past including methamphetamine, ecstasy, marijuana, cocaine, crack cocaine, mushrooms and opiate-based pain killers. The addictive qualities of "Bath Salts" caused an obsession much like crack cocaine. I find that "Bath Salts" are even more addictive than methamphetamine and ecstasy. The "Bath Salts" have much more severe negative side effects than any other drug I have ever taken.
12. "Bath Salts" are by far the worst drug I have ever used, the most addictive and it left my life in ruins.

6. I started using “Spice” about 2 years ago. I only used “Spice” a couple times because I did not like the way it made me feel; it would get me really high and the high was really intense. The feelings I would get using it would cause me to have paranoia and made me feel like I was out of control. It would also cause me to pass out for hours at a time.
7. I started using “Bath Salts” about a year ago. I would use them when I was hung over from alcohol in order to get a boost of energy. The “Bath Salts” would cause me to get really light headed and on one occasion I ended up passing out in the bathroom and almost fell through the glass shower door. “Bath Salts” would cause me to have feelings of paranoia. I experienced weight loss while on “Bath Salts.”
8. “Bath Salts” are extremely addictive. The feelings you get from using “Bath Salts” is that it would get you high but never high enough. While using “Bath Salts” they are even more addictive than methamphetamine because you are always chasing after that immediate high. It seems like it would be easy to overdose on “Bath Salts” because you can never reach the ultimate high but you are always trying.

9. I had a friend that when he would be coming off of "Bath Salts" he would become very angry and mean. I would fear for my safety when around this person when he was coming off of "Bath Salts." His behavior was erratic and unpredictable. At times I was physically assaulted by this person and I saw this person be verbally abusive towards his own kids.



6. I started using “Spice” about 2 or 3 years ago while I lived in Mesa, Arizona. At the end of 2011, I was paroled to Prescott and I started to purchase “Spice” because it would not show up on a drug test. I would purchase from local convenient stores such as The Island Store, Hippie Village, Prescott Quick Stop, Mike’s Mini Mart and the C Stop.
7. When I first started using “Spice” it seemed to have similar effects as marijuana. I would feel extremely lazy and I lacked motivation; this caused me to drop out of college. Over time I noticed that “Spice” would cause me to have an increased heart rate, light headedness and extreme dehydration. On one occasion I felt as if I was having a heart attack. It would also cause me to experience extreme paranoia. I thought people were out to get me and it would cause me to have extreme anxiety attacks. One time I was smoking “Spice” with some friends and I noticed one of my friends had problems standing up and it appeared he was going to collapse. This scared me because I have heard of people dying from using “Spice.”
8. I have used almost every illicit drug there is, including marijuana, alcohol, cocaine, methamphetamine, prescription drugs, heroin, ecstasy, LSD, mushrooms, huffed inhalants, mescaline, GHB and ketamine. The one drug that I made sure to avoid was “Bath Salts.” The reason I avoided “Bath Salts” is because I would see friends start using these and it scared me how fast their

health would deteriorate. The way their health would deteriorate was similar to people I knew, as well as myself, that had used methamphetamine for years but this was occurring in a matter of weeks. I have seen confident, intelligent people reduced to emotional wrecks. On March 18, 2011 I had a friend commit suicide by hanging himself because he was so depressed from the use of "Bath Salts."


1. I am a resident of Yavapai County and I am 24 years old.

6. I started using “Bath Salts” on New Year’s Day of 2012. I felt an urge to use crack cocaine but was unable to locate any so I thought I would try “Bath Salts” because they were easy to get. When I started using “Bath Salts” I did not feel any type of euphoria but experienced immediate negative side effects. I did not have any sense of depth perception; I would feel like the ground was coming up towards me and the sky was falling. I would get an extreme burst of energy and I could not eat anything. When I would try to read something, the words would just seem jumbled up.
7. While on “Bath Salts,” I also experienced extreme paranoia. I thought people were talking about me even strangers as they walked by. I have experienced audio hallucinations and it was as if people were speaking in different languages. I thought the cops were constantly watching me. As a result of the paranoia, I started to avoid interacting with people, I would avoid making eye contact and I hated going into public places. Even though I have been off of “Bath Salts” since March, 2012 I still feel these feelings of paranoia. I have had to receive medication in order to help me deal with these feelings of paranoia.
8. I started using “Spice” around mid February, 2012. “Spice” causes me to have feelings of paranoia but not to the same degree as “Bath Salts.” “Spice” also causes me to have extreme feelings of anxiety and causes my heart to

race. My most recent purchase of "Spice" was approximately 2 weeks ago and I purchased it from The Island Store in Prescott which is located down the street from my half way house.

9. I have used several forms of illicit drugs to include cocaine, crack cocaine, heroin, LSD, methamphetamine, marijuana, PCP, mescaline and prescription pills. I find that both "Bath Salts" and "Spice" are more addictive than any of these illicit drugs. Even though I hate using these products, because they are so addictive, I keep going back to them. This has caused me to get kicked out of my rehab program and to be homeless at time. My addiction to these dangerous synthetic drugs was so great that I would perform sexual favors in exchange for money to buy "Spice."
10. These dangerous synthetic drug products are ruining my life.
